FIRE SAFETY TIPS

The Hampshire Fire Protection District would like to share some Fire Safety Tips for your home and safety.

On November 2nd we switch to daylight savings time. Make sure to change your batteries in your smoke detectors and test them to make sure the detectors still work. The average life span of a smoke detector is 5-10 years.

With the winter months arriving check and/ or change your furnace filters and have your furnace inspected. Keep your family safe from carbon monoxide, which is a odorless and colorless gas.

When using space heaters make sure to plug heaters directly into an outlet rather than a power strip.

Winter months is when the oven is utilized a

lot for cooking and baking. Help prevent oven and stove fires by cleaning the oven and stove surfaces of any grease or drippings.

PREP YOUR HOUSE FOR WINTER

How to prep your house for winter?

Whether you are going on vacation or staying at home this winter, it is a good idea to prep your house for the cold winter weather that we are accustomed to in Northern Illinois. Single-digit temperatures and freezing water can cause significant damage to your house and property. Most insurance claims during the winter are due to freezing and burst pipes, especially when you are away on vacation or visiting family and friends for an extended period. Here are some tips to prep your house for the winter:

- 1. Insulate Indoor Pipes: Use insulation to protect indoor pipes especially under sinks, attics and crawl spaces, pipes along exterior walls, and in basements, where more than 35% of all burst pipes occur.
- 2. Service your fireplaces, chimneys, and furnaces: We all use these to keep ourselves warm during the cold winter days. Make sure to service your fireplace, chimneys, and furnaces at least annually. This will make sure your fireplace, chimneys, and furnaces are working effectively and safely.
- 3. Remove dead and damaged tree limbs: When heavy and wet snow comes to the area in can cause dead and damaged tree limbs to break away and potentially damage your house if in close proximity. Take the time during November to remove any dead and damaged tree limbs.
- 4. Drain and protect outdoor spigots: For hose bibs, shut off the water-supply valve inside your house or basement that feeds the line, then open the outdoor spigot (any water trapped inside will drain out). If you simply shut off the spigot itself, trapped water can freeze and cause a burst pipe inside.
