**RE:** Truth in Taxation Public Hearing and the 2015 Tax Levy Ordinance

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**Background.** The attached information regarding the 2015 Property Tax Levy was presented at the November 5, 2015 Village Board Meeting. As required by law, the Village Board discussed at that meeting the estimate tax levy and set a date of November 19, 2015 for the required public hearing was published in the November 12<sup>th</sup> edition of the Elgin Courier. A copy of the notice is attached.

At the public hearing, staff will outline the proposed tax levy, explain the request for the increase, and field any questions presented by the Village Board or public. Upon closure of the public hearing, the Village Board can consider the Tax Levy Ordinance (scheduled for adoption at the December 3<sup>rd</sup> Village Board Meeting). The Tax Levy Ordinance must be filed with the Kane County Clerk before the last Tuesday of December.

**Recommendation.** Staff recommends holding a public hearing during the November 19<sup>th</sup> Village Board Meeting to comply with the Truth in Taxation requirements.

## **NOTICE OF PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX LEVY FOR THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

- I. A public hearing to approve a proposed property tax levy for the Village of Hampshire, Illinois (the "taxing district") for 2015 will be held at 7:00 PM on November 19, 2015 at Hampshire Village Hall, 234 S. State Street, Hampshire, Illinois 60140.

- II. The corporate and special purpose property taxes extended or abated for 2014 were \$816,640.

The estimated property taxes to be levied for debt service and public building commission leases for 2015 are \$0.

- IV. The total property taxes extended or abated for 2014 were \$816,640.

**AN ORDINANCE  
TO AMEND THE REGULATIONS  
GOVERNING STOP INTERSECTIONS IN THE VILLAGE**

WHEREAS, the Village has previously adopted certain regulations governing and designating stop intersections in the Village, Hampshire Municipal Code, Section 2-4-5/11-904; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have authority to designate an intersection as a stop intersection, and to require all vehicles to stop at one or more entrances to any such intersection, 625 ILCS 5/11-208(a)(6); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it necessary and advisable to modify the provisions establishing such regulations at this time.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as previously amended, shall be and hereby is further amended to modify the regulations governing stop intersections in the Village, in words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER 2	POLICE REGULATIONS
ARTICLE IV	VEHICLE CODE
SECTION 2-4-5/11-904	STOP INTERSECTIONS

A. The Corporate Authorities may from time to time designate certain intersections in the Village as stop intersections, and shall indicate same by posting an appropriate stop sign thereat.

B. Every driver approaching any stop intersection indicated by a stop sign shall stop, and shall thereafter proceed, in accordance with the requirements specified in Section 11-904 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

Section 2. All ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded and waived.

Section 3. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.

**AN ORDINANCE  
TO AMEND THE FINE AMOUNT FOR VIOLATIONS OF SECTION 2-6-5  
FOR UNAUTHORIZED USE OF PARKING PLACES RESERVED FOR  
HANDICAPPED PERSONS IN THE VILLAGE**

WHEREAS, the Village has previously adopted certain regulations governing the use of parking spaces reserved for handicapped persons in the Village, Hampshire Municipal Code, Section 2-6-5; and

WHEREAS, the regulations have set the amount of fine for a violation of such regulations at \$100.00 per violation, Hampshire Municipal Code, Section 2-6-6; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to law, violations of such regulations may be punished by a fine of up to \$350.00 per violation; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it necessary and advisable to increase the amount of fine to be imposed on a person who violates its regulations governing the use of parking spaces reserved for handicapped persons in the Village.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as previously amended, shall be and hereby is further amended to increase the amount of fine to be imposed on any person who violates the Village regulations governing the use of handicapped parking in the Village, in words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER 2	POLICE REGULATIONS
ARTICLE VI	PARKING REGULATIONS
SECTION 2-6-5	UNAUTHORIZED USE OF PARKING PLACES RESERVED FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS

A. No person shall park any motor vehicle which is not bearing registration plates issued to a physically handicapped person pursuant to 625 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/3-616, or to a disabled veteran pursuant to 625 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/3-609, or is not bearing or displaying a handicapped motorist placard, decal or device issued by the State, or by a local governing authority pursuant to 625 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/11-1301.2, in any parking place, including any private or public off-street

parking facility, specifically reserved, by posting of an official sign, for motor vehicles bearing such registration plates, placard, decal or device.

B. Any person violating the provisions of this subsection shall be fined two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each offense.

C. The Corporate Authorities may from time to time designate certain parking spaces as places reserved for handicapped persons, by posting an official sign thereat in accordance with the requirements of law.

Section 2. The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as previously amended, shall be and hereby is further as follows:

CHAPTER 2	POLICE REGULATIONS
ARTICLE VI	PARKING REGULATIONS
SECTION 2-6-6	PENALTY FOR PARKING VIOLATIONS

\* \* \*

B. Except for violations of Section 2-6-5 regarding handicapped parking spaces, if the amount due as prescribed by said citation has not been paid in full within thirty (30) days after date of issuance, then the fine for such violation shall be increased to seventy five dollars (\$75.00); and the village may file a complaint or notice to appear with the Circuit Clerk for proceedings to enforce said citation through court proceedings; and in such case, the Village may request and the court may require the offender to pay court costs in addition to such fine.

C. For each citation issued for a violation of Section 2-6-5 of this section, regarding handicapped parking spaces, the fine shall be two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00). In the event that said fine has not been paid in full within thirty (30) days of issuance of said citation, then the village may file a complaint or notice to appear with the Circuit Clerk for enforcement of said citation through court proceedings; and in such case, the Village may request and the court may require the offender to pay court costs in addition to said fine.

Section 3. All ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded and waived.

Section 4. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.

**RE:** Insurance Coverage Renewal

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**Background.** The Village initiated insurance coverage through Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services (AJG) at this time last year. Nationally AJG provides services to over 5,000 governmental entities encompassing over 500,000 employees and \$30,000,000,000 in property values. They are a national broker with access to over 150 insurance companies and wholesalers, and the relationship to date has been great.

**Analysis.** A premium summary analysis follows this document. The Village will experience a \$4,682 increase in premium or 3.475%. This is a modest increase when compared with the increases experienced previously and the total premium cost for 2016 is more than \$36,000 less than the 2015 renewal premium offered by the Village's former insurance carrier.

**Recommendation.** Staff recommends proceeding with renewal and requests authorization to bind coverage offered by Arthur J. Gallagher through Brit/Underwriters at Lloyd's London (package, auto, umbrella), Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection & Insurance Company (boiler & machinery), Hanover (crime) and the Illinois Public Risk Fund (workers compensation).

**A RESOLUTION  
AUTHORIZING THE APPROVAL AND EXECUTION OF THE FIRST AMENDMENT  
TO THE AMENDED AND RESTATED DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR THE  
TUSCANY WOODS SUBDIVISION, UNIT 1, DATED MAY 30, 2014, AND  
RECORDED AS DOCUMENT NO. 2014K028694**

WHEREAS, in 2014, the Village authorized the approval and execution of a certain Amended and Restated Development Agreement for the Tuscan Woods Subdivision, Unit 1, dated May 1, 2014 and recorded in the Office of the Kane County Recorder as Doc. No. 2014K028694 (the "Amended and Restated Development Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, since the time of the approval of the Amended and Restated Development Agreement, Ryland Homes, n/k/a CalAtlantic Homes, has acquired all but a few of the vacant lots in Unit 1, and intends to proceed with construction and/or completion of the public and private improvements planned for the subdivision; and

WHEREAS, Ryland Homes has otherwise proposed a certain re-zoning of some five (5) lots in Unit 1, and certain variations to be applied to the lots classified in the R-2 Single Family Residential Zoning District, and to the lots classified in the R-3 Two Family Residential Zoning District, respectively, together with a Plat of Re-Subdivision, which re-zoning, variations, and plat will result in an increase in the number of dwelling units to be constructed in the subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have considered the burden of the Special Service Area #13 special bonds that remain outstanding and are to be paid by owners of properties located in Tuscan Woods Subdivision Unit 1, including the current delinquency in payments of debt service thereon; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that it is necessary and advisable to approve said re-zoning, said variations, and said plat in order to facilitate payment of the debt service on said special bonds, and to better assure the successful completion of the public and private improvements in said subdivision; and

WHEREAS, said approvals will affect certain terms and conditions stated in the Amended and Restated Development Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find it necessary and advisable to amend the Amended and Restated Development Agreement in order to describe the orderly completion of improvements and future development of the territory comprising the

Tuscany Woods Subdivision Unit 1, in the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The proposed First Amendment to the Amended and Restated Development Agreement for the Tuscany Woods Subdivision, Unit 1, dated May 30, 2014 and recorded as Doc. No. 2014K028694 (the "First Amendment"), as attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, shall be and is hereby approved.

Section 2. The Village President is hereby authorized and directed to execute the First Amendment on behalf of the Village, in substantially the form as attached hereto and subject to such corrections and/or modifications that may be approved by the Village President after consultation with the Village Attorney; and the Village Clerk is authorized and directed to attest to the signature of the Village President, after first receiving an executed original from CalAtlantic Homes, f/k/a Ryland Homes, current owner of the affected property.

Section 3. The First Amendment shall promptly thereafter be recorded in the office of the Kane County Recorder at the expense of CalAtlantic Homes.

Section 4. The recitals set forth above are hereby made a part of this Resolution.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDED AND RESTATED DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR TUSCANY WOODS SUBDIVISION, UNIT 1 ("First Amendment"), is entered into as of the 19<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2015, by and between the Village of Hampshire, an Illinois Municipal Corporation, with its principal offices at 234 South State Street, Hampshire, IL 60140-0457 (the "Village"), and CalAtlantic Homes, LLC, a Delaware corporation ("CalAtlantic"), successor by merger to The Ryland Group, Inc. ("Ryland"), current owner, 1141 East Main Street, Suite 108, East Dundee, IL 60118 ("Owner").

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2014, the then owner of Tuscan Woods Subdivision, Unit 1 ("Unit 1") and the Village entered into a certain Amended and Restated Development Agreement, which document was recorded in the Office of the Kane County Recorder as Document No. 2014K028694 (the "Amended and Restated Development Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, in April, 2015, Ryland acquired title to the lots described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, thereafter Ryland merged with Standard Pacific Corporation to form a new entity, CalAtlantic; and

WHEREAS, CalAtlantic has submitted to the Village a final plat of re-subdivision for Unit 1, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision"); and

WHEREAS, the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision was reviewed and approved by the Village, subject to final review and approval of the Village Engineer; and

WHEREAS, CalAtlantic also filed with the Village a petition for re-zoning of certain lots in Unit 1 to re-classify said lots from the R-3 Two Family Residential Zoning District to the R-4 Multi-Family Residential Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, CalAtlantic also filed with the Village a petition for certain variations of the lot area, lot width, and side yard requirements for lots in the R-2 Single Family Residential Zoning District and in the R-3 Two-Family Residential Zoning District.

NOW THEREFORE IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS CONTAINED HEREIN, AND OTHER GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, RECEIPT OF WHICH IS HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGED, IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Amended and Restated Development Agreement shall be and is amended as set forth herein, as follows:

A. Add a new WHEREAS clause:

WHEREAS, a final plat of re-subdivision for the Subject Property, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit "RR," was approved by the Village, and shall be or has been duly recorded in the Office of the Kane County Recorder (the "Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision").

B. Amend Paragraph 3:

(a) Pursuant to the Original Development Agreement, the construction, maintenance and operation of a sanitary sewer system and potable water system and the construction of the other public improvements herein and therein described is based on the Original Developer's, Owner's, PHI's and the Village's understanding relative to the zoning, subdivision and development of the Subdivision, as set forth in the Original Development Agreement and the Preliminary Plan approved as an element thereof. Accordingly, the Parties agree, subject to sub-paragraph (j) below, that: (i) in Unit 1 there shall be no more than ~~106~~127 single-family lots platted and no more than ~~106~~127 single-family Dwelling Units constructed, no more than 44 51 duplex lots platted and no more than ~~88~~102 duplex Dwelling Units constructed, and no more than 30 townhome lots platted and no more than 163 townhome Dwelling Units constructed; and (ii) in Unit 2 there shall be no more than 263 single-family lots platted and no more than 263 total single-family Dwelling Units constructed and no more than 18 duplex lots and 36 duplex Dwelling Units constructed. ~~In furtherance of the foregoing, the Parties acknowledge that the Unit 1 Final Plat contains a scrivener's error in the zoning table referenced thereon. In order to correct the error Owner shall prepare a Certificate of Correction to properly identify the number of single family, duplex and townhome lots platted in Unit 1. The Village agrees to cooperate with Owner to approve and record the Certificate of Correction.~~

(b) Subject to the work to be performed pursuant to the Updated Punch List (hereinafter defined), the Village hereby confirms and agrees that the Subject Property has to date been developed substantially in accordance with (i) the Unit 1 Final Plat; (ii) the Final Engineering Plans for Unit 1 prepared by Cowhey Gudmundson Leder, Ltd. dated April 15, 2005, and last revised May 11, 2007, which plans are generally referred to as Exhibit "CC", the cover page of which is attached hereto for recording purposes and which plans are available in their entirety at the office of the Village Engineer (the "Unit 1 Final Engineering Plans"); and (iii) the Landscape Plans prepared by Landworks, Ltd. as last revised on June 26, 2006 (under date of May 2, 2006), which plans are generally referred to as Exhibit "DD", the cover page of which is attached hereto for recording purposes and which plans are available in their entirety at the office of the Village Engineer (the "Landscape Plans"). The Village further confirms its prior approval of the departures from the Subdivision Code set forth in sub-paragraph (g) below to permit the development of the Subject Property in accordance with the Unit 1 Final Plat and the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision as to Unit 1, and in accordance with the Preliminary Plan as to Unit 2, respectively.

(c) The Village hereby confirms the approval of and hereby agrees that the gross site area and lot area requirements for single family detached Dwelling Units (12,000 square foot minimum and 8,820 square foot minimum) shall be as depicted on, respectively, the Unit 1 Final Plat and the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision and shall be governed by sub-paragraph (c) of Section 6-7-1 of the Hampshire Zoning Ordinance, 2003. The lot width requirements and the front, rear, side and corner side yard requirements for the 12,000 square foot minimum lots and the 8,820 square foot minimum lots and the gross site area, lot area, lot width requirements and yard requirements (front, rear, side and corner side yard) for the 12,000 square foot minimum lots and the 8,820 square foot minimum lots shall be as depicted on, respectively, the Unit 1 Final Plat and the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision and governed by Section 6-7-2 of the Hampshire Zoning Ordinance, 2003, except as modified by Ordinance No. 15-25 (see sub-paragraph 3(j) below).

(d) The Village hereby confirms the approval of and hereby agrees that the gross site area, lot area, lot width requirements and the yard requirements (front, rear, side and corner side yards) for the duplex Dwelling Units constructed in Unit 1 shall be as depicted on the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision and shall be governed by sub-paragraph (c) in Section 6-7-3 of the Hampshire Zoning Ordinance, 2003, except as modified by Ordinance No. 15-24 (see sub-paragraph 3(j) below).

(e) The Village hereby confirms the approval of and hereby agrees that the gross site area, lot area, lot width requirements and the yard requirements (front, rear, side, and corner side yards) for the townhome Dwelling Units constructed in Unit 1 shall be as depicted on the Unit 1 Final Plat and the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision and governed by sub-paragraph (c) of Section 6-7-4 of the Hampshire Zoning Ordinance, 2003. Townhome Dwelling Units shall be permitted to be developed in three, four, five and six unit buildings, as depicted on the Unit 1 Final Plat and the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision.

(f) The Village hereby confirms the approval of and hereby agrees that the provisions of the Village Building Code, Hampshire Municipal Code, Chapter V, Section 5-1-1 *et seq.* in effect as of May 1, 2014, to wit: International Building Code Council,

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2006 Edition, as modified by Village Ordinance No. 08-40; and the Village Zoning Code, Hampshire Municipal Code, Chapter VI, Section 6-1-1 *et seq.*; and the Village Subdivision Code, Chapter VII, Sections 7-1-1 *et seq.*, in effect as of the date of the Original Development Agreement, shall apply to the development of the Subject Property, except as otherwise expressly and specifically set forth in this Amended Agreement and the First Amendment to this Amended Agreement.

\* \* \*

(j) During the course of development of the Subject Property Owner and any Unit 1 Owner may, at their sole cost and expense, seek additional zoning approvals and subdivision variations, which approvals or variations shall be subject to Village approval in accordance with all applicable Village codes and ordinances, without the need for further amending this Amended Agreement and without the approval of either PHI or any Unit 2 Owner. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the Village has approved certain variations to the zoning standards otherwise provided by Village Code, as follows:

i) For lots classified in the R-2 Single Family Residential Zoning District in Unit 1, by Ordinance No. 15-25, enacted on November 5, 2015, which variations shall apply to the lots depicted on the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision only, as follows:

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1) A variation of the requirement of Section 6-7-2(C)(1) of the Village Code, which requires a minimum lot area of not less than twelve thousand (12,000) square feet, in order to allow for a lot area of not less than eight thousand, eight hundred twenty (8,820) square feet on the Subject Property;

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2) A variation of the requirement of Section 6-7-2(C)(2) of the Village Code, which requires a minimum lot width of not less than one hundred (100) feet, in order to allow for a lot width of not less than seventy (70) feet on the Subject Property;

3) A variation of the requirement of Section 6-7-2(C)(7) of the Village Code, which requires side yards totaling not less than twenty (20) feet, with neither side yard being less than ten (10) feet, to allow for side yards totaling not less than sixteen (16) feet on the Subject Property.

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ii) For lots classified in the R-3 Two-Family Residential Zoning District in Unit 1, by Ordinance No. 15-24, enacted on November 5, 2015, which variations shall apply to the lots depicted on the Unit 1 Final Plat of Re-Subdivision only, as follows

1) A variation of the requirement of Section 6-7-3(C)(1) of the Village Code, which requires a minimum lot area of not less than six thousand three hundred (6,300) square feet for each dwelling unit in two-family detached dwellings, in order to allow for a lot area of not less than eight thousand, one hundred ninety (8,190) square feet in total, on the Subject Property;

2) A variation of the requirement of Section 6-7-3(C)(2) of the Village Code, which requires a minimum lot width of not less than eighty (80) feet, in order to allow for a lot width of not less than sixty-five (65) feet on the Subject Property;

3) A variation of the requirement of Section 6-7-3(C)(7) of the Village Code, which requires side yards totaling not less than twenty (20) feet, with neither side yard being less than ten (10) feet, to allow for side yards having a combined width of not less than fifteen (15) feet and neither side yard shall being less than five (5) feet in width on the Subject Property.

C. Amend Paragraph 4, sub-paragraph 4(b), as follows:

(b) Reservation of Capacity. For the Term of this Amended Agreement the Village shall reserve wastewater treatment capacity in the WWTF and wastewater transmission capacity in the Hampshire Creek Interceptor Sewer in the amounts and to the extent necessary to provide sanitary sewer services to and for all of Unit 1, as it is contemplated to be developed pursuant to this Amended Agreement and the First Amendment to this Amended Agreement. The Parties acknowledge that wastewater transmission lines have been constructed in Unit 1 which connect to wastewater transmission lines in the White Oak Ponds Subdivision immediately west of Unit 1 (which lines in turn connect to the West Side Interceptor Sewer, sometimes referred to historically as the Southeast Interceptor Sewer). For the Term of this Amended Agreement the Village shall reserve 612.5 P.E. (i.e., 3.5 P.E. times 175 single-family dwelling units) of wastewater transmission capacity in the West Side Interceptor Sewer for Unit 1 Owners. The Parties agree that such wastewater transmission lines shall be disconnected from the West Side Interceptor Sewer and connected to the Hampshire Creek Interceptor Sewer via the Connecting Sewer Main and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Paragraph 4.

D. Amend Paragraph 12, sub-paragraph 12(d), as follows:

(d) The Parties agree that Owner and any Unit 1 Owner covenant that to the extent Owner or any Unit 1 Owner, as the case may be, have an ownership interest in any public improvements presently serving or intended to serve the Unit 2 Property as contemplated in the Preliminary Plan or the Unit 1 Final Engineering Plans, together with the Final Plat of Re-Subdivision and related engineering plans, respectively, neither Owner nor any Unit 1 Owner shall obstruct any Unit 2 Owner's ability to utilize such public improvements, specifically including but not limited to the detention ponds located on Lot 1023 and Lot 1025, it being understood, however, that the capacity in such ponds may only be available to a Unit 2 Owner in the amount it needs if: (i) such Unit 2 Owner plats and develops Unit 2 with no greater number of dwelling units than is contemplated by this Amended Agreement; and (ii) there are no changes in law or regulation which reduces the capacities of such ponds or their ability to serve Unit 2 development.

2. This First Amendment is made pursuant to Paragraph 22 of the Amended and Restated Development Agreement, with the consent of the legal title holder of the property subject to the terms and provisions of this First Amendment, to wit: CalAtlantic, successor to Ryland.



3. The Village represents and acknowledges that, as of the date of this First Amendment, there are no defaults existing under the Amended and Restated Development Agreement.

4. In all other respects, the Amended and Restated Development Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, according to its terms.

**MEMORANDUM**

**RE:** Peddlers / Solicitors

**Background**

The Village has recently experienced some difficulties with door-to-door solicitors and has reviewed its general regulations governing such activities in the Village. There are two sections of the Village Code which are pertinent to this situation, governing “solicitors” and “peddlers,” respectively.

**Question Presented**

What regulations may the village impose on peddlers or solicitors in the Village?

**Discussion**

The Illinois Municipal Code provides as follows:

§11-42-5: The Corporate Authorities of each municipality may license, tax, regulate, or prohibit hawkers, peddlers, pawnbrokers, itinerant merchants, transient vendors of merchandise, theatricals and other exhibitions, shows, and amusements and may license, tax, and regulate all places for eating or amusement.

The Village currently regulates “Peddlers” in Section 4-5-1 of the Village Code, and “Solicitors” in Section 4-3-1 of the Village Code.

For purposes of such regulation, there are four categories to be considered:

1. Peddlers -- salesmen who go door to door, or who only temporarily intend to do business in the Village, to sell goods. This is probably an obsolete category. In the old days, maybe a “Fuller Brush” man or “Avon lady.” Currently, it is more common to only “solicit” orders for goods – see #2 below.

- These could be prohibited altogether / restricted as to location.
- These could be required to obtain a license / restricted as to hours / prohibited from going door-to-door.

2. Solicitors -- salesmen who go door to door to solicit orders for goods or services. For example, energy companies, phone companies; or magazine or newspaper subscriptions.

- These could be prohibited altogether / restricted as to location.
- These could be required to obtain a license / restricted as to hours / prohibited from going door-to-door.

3. Solicitors – persons seeking charitable contributions to a cause, either door-to-door, or standing at a stop intersection. For example, Poppy Day; other “intersection” fund raisers; school fund-raisers.

- These could be prohibited altogether.
- These could be required to obtain a license / restricted as to hours / prohibited from going door-to-door.
- An exception might be created for anyone soliciting from less than \_\_\_ person in total – allows neighborhood solicitation by high schooler, for example.

4. Solicitors – persons distributing political or religious tracts, and/or seeking contributions. Jehovah’s Witnesses; Mormon missionaries; political candidates distributing campaign flyers.

- These are protected by First Amendment / Freedom of Speech rights and may not be restricted.
- No licensing or even registration may be required.
- The Village might impose some restriction on hours – but courts have demanded some particular study / support for position taken (i.e., it is not enough to say that crime increases after dark – there must be some statistical evidence of same).
- In general, courts leave it to a private property owner to decline to meet with or listen to any such solicitor.

It may be possible to ban “peddlers” (#1 above) from door-to-door activities. Note that the definition also covers those who are “temporarily” in business. This might cover booths at Coon Creek? The auto show in Seyller Park? Others?

It may be possible to ban “solicitors” (#2 above) from door-to-door activities.

What position would the Village take regarding solicitors (#3 above)?

Solicitors (#4 above) cannot be banned, and courts have also held that they may not be required to

obtain a license, or even to “register” when operating in town.

It is also a concern of the Village Clerk and Chief of Police that any license issued to a “peddler” or “solicitor” be revocable. Some procedure by which this could occur ought to be included in any regulations. Two options might be considered:

- A license is suspended upon any formal charge that a “peddler” or “solicitor” has violated the local regulations. Upon conviction in the local court, the license would be revoked.
- A license could be immediately revoked by the Chief of Police upon his determination that a violation of the local regulations has occurred. That determination could then be appealed to the Village Administrator (if that position is then filled), or the Village President (if not) – or to the Board of Trustees (as another alternative).

Attached is a re-write of the Village’s existing regulations, for consideration by the Board of Trustees.

#### Action(s) Needed

- A. Consider the proposed modifications to the existing regulations and determine if any action is needed at this time.
- B. Consider banning any door-to-door “peddlers” (#1 above) as described above.
- C. Consider also banning any door-to-door “solicitors” (#2, #3 above) as described above.
- D. Consider an exception for charitable fund raising (#3 above).
- E. Note the exception for political and religious “solicitors” (#4 above).
- F. Consider also the procedure / alternative procedure for revocation of any license issued by the Village.

## VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE PEDDLERS - SOLICITORS

### PEDDLERS

#### 4-5-1: DEFINITION:

"Peddler" shall mean any person, firm, or business entity ~~corporation~~ who, in the Village, for itself, or by its agents, employees, or servants, by going from place to place, or with only a temporary location for doing business and not intending to establish a permanent place for such business, in the Village, sells at retail, offers for sale, sells and delivers, barter or exchanges any goods, wares, merchandise, or any other article or thing whatsoever, or any service not ordered by telephone, computer link, or other remote communication.

The term "peddler" shall include persons who will engage in the activities described in this section during any festival, fair, trade show, exposition, flea market, or like event to be held within the Village.

#### 4-5-2: LICENSE REQUIRED:

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the business of peddler within the village without having first obtained a license therefor. Any person engaged in the business of peddler in the village shall maintain on his or her person at all times the license issued to him or her under this article; and exhibit same to any person upon request.

#### 4-5-3: APPLICATION:

A. An application for a peddler license shall be filed with the village clerk. The application must be filed with the Village Clerk not less than ten (10) days prior to the commencement of peddling activities in the Village.

1. Such application shall state the name, date of birth, social security number, permanent address, and current telephone number of the applicant; type of article or thing to be peddled in the village; and the make, model and registration number of any vehicle(s) to be utilized by the applicant while engaged in the business of peddler within the village.
2. Each applicant shall deliver to the village clerk a valid identification document, with a photograph, verifying the identification information on the application.
3. Such application, and shall be accompanied by payment of the required fee.
3. The Village Clerk may request a background check, including via fingerprinting, by the Police Department prior to issuance of any peddler's license.

4-5-4: LICENSE FEE:

The fee for a peddler's license shall be as established from time to time by the village board of trustees.

4-3-5: QUALIFICATIONS FOR LICENSE:

No license shall be issued to any person:

- A. Who has been convicted of the commission of a felony under the laws of Illinois, or any other state, or the federal law of the United States, within five (5) years of the date of application;
- B. Who has been convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this article;
- C. Who has had any license previously issued under this article which has been revoked;
- D. Who is in default of any obligation to the village under this code.

~~4-5-6~~: ISSUANCE OR DENIAL OF LICENSE:

After consideration of the application and all pertinent information, the village clerk shall issue or deny the license forthwith. A peddler's license shall be issued for a definite period of time not to exceed \_\_\_\_\_ days in total; and may limit or restrict the hours of peddling activities of the licensee notwithstanding the limitation otherwise prescribed in Section 4-5-9 below.

~~4-5-7~~: LICENSE; NONTRANSFERABILITY:

Any license issued under the provisions of this article shall authorize only the person to whom such license was issued to engage in the business of peddler. No such license shall be transferable or assignable; and no person duly licensed under this article shall have any power to authorize any other person to engage in such business in his stead.

4-5-8: DISCLOSURE

Any license issued by the Village, and any application for license filed with the Village Clerk (whether or not a license is issued) shall be a public record. Any licensee to whom a license is issued by the Village may be identified on the Village website or social media.

4-5-6: TRANSIENT MERCHANTS:

The requirements of this article shall apply to any person, firm or corporation who may open a place of business for the sale within the village, temporarily and not intending to

establish a permanent place for such business, to sell at retail, offer for sale, sell and deliver, barter or exchange any goods, wares, merchandise, or any other article or thing whatsoever, or any service not ordered by telephone, computer link, or other remote communication, and such person shall be considered a peddler for purposes of this article.

4-5-~~7~~: PROHIBITED CONDUCT:

A. It shall be unlawful for any peddler to go from house to house, place to place, or street to street in the village; provided, this prohibition shall not apply to persons who make regular sales or deliveries of goods or services by prior agreement with the occupant of any property, house or other place in the Village.

B. It shall be unlawful for any peddler to cheat or deceive any person in the village, or to fraudulently misrepresent the quality, price or amount of the goods, wares, merchandise, article or thing, or service sold, offered for sale, sold and delivered, bartered or exchanged, including promise of any refund without providing a written statement of the refund terms and conditions.

CB. Any peddler, upon arriving upon any private property on which has conspicuously posted a sign, "No Peddlers", or substantially similar sign, shall refrain from entering and/or immediately and peacefully depart from the premises, and it shall be unlawful for such peddler to remain on the property.

DC. Any peddler who has entered onto any private property, whether invited thereon or not, shall immediately and peacefully depart therefrom when requested to do so by the occupant, and it shall be unlawful for such peddler to remain on the property after such request.

D. Any peddler shall at all times conduct himself or herself in accordance with this code, local ordinances, state and federal laws and regulations, and no peddler shall violate any such code, ordinances, laws or regulations.

EE. No person shall engage in the business of peddler prior to nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. and later than eight o'clock (8:00) P.M. on any day, Monday through Saturday, or outside the hours of peddling activities allowed by his or her peddler's license, if different.

FF. No person shall engage in the business of peddler on any Sunday, or any state or national holiday.

F. Any peddler shall at all times conduct himself or herself in accordance with this code, local ordinances, state and federal laws and regulations, and no peddler shall violate any such code, ordinances, laws or regulations.

4-5-~~98~~: SUSPENSION; REVOCATION:

Any license issued under this article may be suspended by the Chief of Police if the

holder of such license is charged with or arrested for an alleged violation of the provisions of this article.

ALTERNATIVE: Any license issued under this article may be revoked by the Chief of Police upon his determination that the holder of such license has violated the provisions of this article, or any law. Upon such revocation, the former license holder may appeal the determination of the Chief of Police to the Village Administrator, if anyone is then holding that office, and if not, then to the Village President. In order to proceed with such appeal, the former license holder shall file a written statement declaring such appeal, together with any supporting information, with the Village Clerk within 10 days of such revocation.

Any license issued under this article shall be revoked by the village clerk if the holder of the license is convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this article, or has made a false material statement in the application, or otherwise becomes disqualified for the issuance of a license; or if the village clerk has determined that the holder of such license made a false statement in his or her application.

A. Immediately upon such suspension or revocation, as the case may be, written notice thereof shall be given to the holder of the license, in person or by certified mail, return receipt requested, at the address or addresses listed on the holder's application. Any license previously issued shall be deemed so suspended, or shall become null and void, immediately upon personal delivery of such notice, or three (3) days after such mailing.

B. Any person whose license to engage in the business of peddler in the village has been suspended or revoked may appeal such action ~~revocation~~ to the Corporate Authorities ~~board of trustees~~ of the village by filing a written notice of such appeal with the village clerk. The Corporate Authorities ~~board of trustees~~ shall consider said appeal at its next regularly scheduled meeting after the date of filing, and shall render a decision thereon as soon thereafter as practicable.

4-5-~~10~~<sup>9</sup>: PENALTY:

Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be subject to penalty as provided in section 12-1-3 of this code. Each day that any offense shall exist or continue shall constitute a separate offense.



## SOLICITORS

### 4-3-1: DEFINITION:

### 4-3-2: LICENSE REQUIRED:

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the business ~~or purpose~~ of solicitor or to have charge of, direct, or employ two or more persons to engage in the business of solicitor in the Village, without having first obtained a license therefor. Any person engaged in the business of solicitor in the village shall maintain on his or her person at all times the license issued to him or her under this article; ~~and shall exhibit same to any person upon request.~~

### 4-3-3: APPLICATION:

A. An application for a solicitor license shall be filed with the village clerk.

- ~~1. For an individual, such application shall include The applicant for such license shall state his or her name, date of birth, social security number, permanent residence address, current telephone number, and place of abode while working as a solicitor in the village, or manager of solicitors, in the village; the name, business address, and telephone number of applicant's employer, if any; the type of article or thing which is to be the subject of his/her solicitations; the number of days the applicant intends to be engaged in the business of solicitor, or manager of solicitors, in the village; and the make, model and registration number of any vehicle(s) to be utilized by the applicant while engaged in the business of solicitor within the village.~~
- ~~2. For a manager, such application shall include name, date of birth, social security number, permanent residence address, current telephone number, and place of abode while working as such manager in the village; the name and~~

address of the manager's employer, together with the name and telephone number of a contact person from said employer; the type of article or thing which is to be the subject of his/her solicitations; the number of days the applicant intends to be engaged in said business in the village; the make, model and registration number of any vehicle(s) to be utilized by the applicant while engaged in the business of solicitor within the village; and a copy of the application for license of each person said manager will be managing during solicitation activities in the village.

3. Each applicant shall deliver to the village clerk a valid identification document, with a photograph, verifying the identification information on the application.
4. The application shall be accompanied by payment of the required fee.
5. The Village Clerk may request a background check, including via fingerprinting, by the Police Department prior to issuance of any peddler's license.
6. A peddler's license shall be issued for a definite period of time not to exceed \_\_\_\_\_ days in total, and may limit or restrict the hours of solicitation activities to be engaged in within the Village notwithstanding the limitation otherwise prescribed in Section 4-3-9 below.

4-3-4: LICENSE FEE:

The fee for a solicitor's license shall be as established from time to time by the village board of trustees.

4-3-5: QUALIFICATIONS FOR LICENSE:

No license shall be issued to any person:

- A. Who has been convicted of the commission of a felony under the laws of Illinois, or any other state, or the federal law of the United States, within five (5) years of the date of application;
- B. Who has been convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of this article;
- C. Who has had any license previously issued under this article which has been revoked;
- D. Who is in default of any obligation to the village under this code.

4-3-6: EXEMPTION FROM LICENSING REQUIREMENT:

The requirements of this article for licensing of solicitors shall not apply to those persons who distribute religious or political literature or materials, and/or who seek to engage in discussion of religious or political topics or issues, and/or who ask for

donations or contributions for religious or political causes, from a fixed location or by going door-to-door or place-to-place or street-to-street; provided, except for the prohibition of Section 4-3-10(A), the prohibitions otherwise set forth in Section 4-3-9 below shall apply to such persons.

4-3-7: ISSUANCE OR DENIAL OF LICENSE:

After consideration of the application and all pertinent information, the village clerk shall issue or deny the license forthwith.

4-3-8: DISCLOSURE

Any license issued by the Village, and any application for such license, shall be a public record. Any licensee to whom a license is issued may be identified on the Village website and/or social media.

4-3-9-7: LICENSE; NONTRANSFERABILITY:

Any license issued under the provisions of this article shall authorize only the person to whom such license was issued to engage in the business of solicitor; no such license shall be transferable or assignable; and no person duly licensed under this article shall have any power to authorize any other person to engage in such business in his stead.

4-3-108: PROHIBITED CONDUCT:

A. It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to go from house to house, place to place or street to street in the village.

B. It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to cheat or deceive any person in the village; or to fraudulently misrepresent the quality, price or amount of any goods, wares, merchandise, article or thing, or service, for which orders are taken in the village; or to fraudulently misrepresent the purpose of any solicitation, or the person, firm or entity to be benefited thereby; or to misrepresent that a donor will be eligible for a tax deduction for any donation or contribution solicited.

CB. Any solicitor, upon arriving at any private property on which has conspicuously posted a sign, "No Solicitors", or a substantially similar sign, shall immediately and peacefully depart from the premises, and it shall be unlawful for such solicitor to remain on the property.

DC. Any solicitor who has entered onto any private property, whether invited thereon or not, shall immediately and peacefully depart therefrom when requested to do so by the occupant, and it shall be unlawful for such solicitor to remain on the property after such request.

D. Any solicitor shall at all times conduct himself or herself in accordance with this code, local ordinances, state and federal laws and regulations, and no solicitor shall violate any such code, ordinances, laws or regulations.

~~EE.~~ No person shall engage in the business of solicitor prior to nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. and later than eight o'clock (8:00) P.M. ~~on Monday through Saturday.~~

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~~FF.~~ No person shall engage in the business of solicitor on any Sunday, or any state or national holiday.

~~G.~~ Any solicitor shall at all times conduct himself or herself in accordance with this code, local ordinances, state and federal laws and regulations, and no solicitor shall violate any such code, ordinances, laws or regulations.

#### 4-3-119: SUSPENSION; REVOCATION:

Any license issued under this article ~~may be suspended by the Chief of Police if the holder of such license is charged with or arrested for an alleged violation of the provisions of this article.~~

*~~ALTERNATIVE: Any license issued under this article may be revoked by the Chief of Police upon his determination that the holder of such license has violated the provisions of this article, or any law. Upon such revocation, the former license holder may appeal the determination of the Chief of Police to the Village Administrator, if anyone is then holding that office, and if not, then to the Village President. In order to proceed with such appeal, the former license holder shall file a written statement declaring such appeal, together with any supporting information, with the Village Clerk within 10 days of such revocation.~~*

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**MEMORANDUM**

**TO:** Village President and Board of Trustees

**RE:** Alteration of Speed Limits in the Village

**Background**

The Village currently is governed by the general regulations of the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code, providing that the maximum speed limit in any “urban district” shall be 30 mph, and shall be 55 mph “for all other highways, roads and streets.” The Village has authority to alter any applicable speed limit under Section 11-604 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

Ketchum Road is a highway of about 1.15 miles in distance lying partly within the Village (.25 miles.) and partly within the county (.90 miles). The speed limit on Ketchum Road is currently set at 45 mph along its entire length. It has been suggested that the 45 mile per hour speed limit on Ketchum Road is greater than is reasonable given the presence of both Wright Elementary School and Hampshire High School, together with the entrance drive (designated, “Whippur Way”), along this highway.

**Question Presented**

Whether the Village may impose a speed limit of less than 45 miles per hour on Ketchum Road in the Village?

**Discussion**

Local authorities such as the Village are authorized to impose a speed limit greater or less than the limit imposed by the general provisions of the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code under Section 11-604 of the Illinois Vehicle Code.

To do so, the Corporate Authorities are to make a determination “upon the basis of an engineering or traffic investigation concerning a highway or street” that a maximum speed limit prescribed in the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code “is greater or less than is reasonable or safe with respect to the conditions found to exist at any place or along any part of zone of such highway or street.”<sup>1</sup>

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<sup>1</sup> It has been noted that an adjustment to such a speed zone may be made “at the school district’s request...for student safety purposes.” This proviso appears only in Section 11-602: “Alteration of limits by Department [of Transportation],” and empowers only IDOT to so act. The proviso does not appear in Section 11-604: “Alteration of limits by local authorities,” such as the Village of Hampshire.

When such a different speed limit is imposed, “appropriate signs giving notice of the limit” are to be erected “at the proper place or along the proper part or zone of the highway or street” in question.

**Action(s) Needed**

A. Obtain an engineering or traffic investigation concerning the various streets of the Village, from which the Corporate Authorities may make a determination that a greater or lesser speed limit is reasonable or safe, with respect to the existing conditions on Ketchum Road, south of Big Timber Road.

B. If warranted by such study, then enact an ordinance establishing the new (reduced) speed limit.

C. Post appropriate signs to give notice of the speed limit to motorists.
