2024 Year in Review

2024 was another special year for the Village of Hampshire's residents and visitors. A lot has happened and it's time for a wrap up and read about a few highlights of the past year.

The Village continues to see significant steady growth especially with residential construction. In 2024, 158 new residential construction permits were issued by the Village, totaling an approximate investment of \$31.5 million by home builders into the Village. The development of Prairie Ridge North continues with Neighborhoods T, Z, and AA under construction, and additional neighborhoods to have the Final Plats of Subdivision approved in early 2025 by the Village.

In total, almost 700 building permits were issued in 2024 representing a private investment of \$46.2 million.

If you are planning a building/construction project in 2025 make sure to check with the Village if a building permit is needed if you are unsure.

The Village hosted or partnered on many Special Events throughout the year and will continue to do so in 2025. 2024's special events ended with the Jingle Fest Parade in the beginning of December with the Holiday Tree lighting and Santa visiting Hampshire. These events are important in creating community amongst our residents, visitors, and public officials. Another major event held during the year is the Coon Creek Country Days Festival where approximately a few thousand people come together to celebrate Hampshire. Plan to attend one of the many events hosted in Hampshire next year to meet new friends and neighbors.

As every year, the Streets & Utilities Departments were busy this year maintaining and improving the Village's infrastructure. In 2024, portions of Kelley Road, Terwilliger Avenue, and Panama Avenue were resurfaced. Over 164 sidewalk defects were repaired in the Hampshire Prairie Subdivision. A new bike path was constructed on North State Street. The Utilities Department has been busy identifying and developing a plan to replace lead service lines on the Village side.

In 2024, the Hampshire Police Department start utilizing its VirTra 300 training simulator. The VirTra 300 training simulator helped modernize and help our Police Officers maximize their training in many areas of policing such as use of force, de-escalation, mental health, and crisis intervention techniques. The Hampshire Police Department held an Open House to show how the training simulator works in March 2024. The training simulator funded through a Federal COPS De-Escalation Grant the Hampshire Police Department was awarded.

WINTER PARKING BAN

The winter parking ban restriction is in effect from November 1st through March 31st.

Parking on all streets is prohibited between 1 AM – 6 AM.

If you do not have a garage, driveway, or access to a public parking lot close to your home, parking permits are available through the Hampshire Police Department.

All off-street parking must be on a paved surface. Parking on grass is not allowed.

The new Public Works Facility will be key in protecting the Village's vehicles and equipment from the outdoor conditions, which will help save money in the long run.

SNOWMOBILE SAFETY TIPS

Trails are open from December 10th to March 15th when there is 4 inches of snow on frozen ground or 6 inches of snow on unfrozen ground.

Riding on any Village street is permitted STRICTLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF GETTING TO AND FROM THE TRAIL AT A SPEED OF 15 MPH OR LESS.

NO JOY RIDING IN THE VILLAGE.

When operating a snowmobile stay off sidewalks and grassy surfaces, such as parkways or lawns.

STAY OUT OF THE PARKS.

Riding on State Street is prohibited, however, crossing State Street is permitted except between Terwilliger and Washington (Downtown Business District) due to poor visibility.

Go to the Hampshire White Riders website to check on the current trail conditions.



MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC AGGREGATION



Municipal Electric Aggregation allows Illinois municipalities to purchase electricity for residents and small businesses from a source other than ComEd. Though service and billing are still provided by ComEd, your electricity source maybe coming from a different company. The Village of Hampshire is currently not participating in a Municipal Electric Aggregation Program. However, residents can still individually sign up with another energy company. If you have signed up for an alternative electricity source you may want to check to see if you are paying higher than the ComEd rates.

STAY WARM WHILE SAVING ENERGY

This winter keep utility costs down and save energy. Here are some tips for you:

1. Find and seal leaks. Add caulk or weatherstripping to seal air leaks. Pay attention to areas around windows, doors, and hose faucets, as well as where siding overlaps with the foundation.

Install storm windows. Single-pane windows can let in a lot of cold air. Storm windows mount to the exterior of existing windows and provide an extra layer of protection.

Add attic insulation. Attic insulation will help your home stay warm during the winter months and stay cool in the summer.

4. Install a smart thermostat. With a smart thermostat, you'll be able to control your home's temperature using your phone or tablet. You can also create comfort settings that account for occupancy and time of day.
