#### **JULIE LANE GETS A MAKEOVER**

#### Residents of Julie Lane Appreciated For Patience and Cooperation

The Village of Hampshire completed the rehabilitation of Julie Lane which included pavement removal, base repair, repair of deteriorated sidewalks, curb and gutter repair, and new asphalt pavement.

#### **Capital Improvement Plan**

The Julie Avenue Project is one of several projects included in the Village Three Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) scheduled for the current fiscal year ending April 30, 2022. The CIP is a multi-year planning document designed to review the Village's anticipated capital needs and purchases the Village will make during the plan

period. Ultimately, the CIP's goal is to ensure that the Village's infrastructure, buildings, fleet, and equipment can meet both the service needs of the public and the operational needs of the organization. As one of the Village's core planning documents, the CIP is updated annually and focuses on the three upcoming fiscal years following the current year. The plan is a guideline for capital spending and is reviewed and updated annually as priorities change.

#### **Supervision and Coordination**

The Village of Hampshire Public Works Department and a representative of Engineering Enterprises were on site to coordinate the reconstruction and assure that all went smoothly.

The project was completed with limited lane closures and parking restrictions.

There were no major roadway

closures to encumber the residents living on Julie Lane.

Thanks to all the residents of Julie Lane. Your cooperation and patience during this project were greatly appreciated.

#### **Other Capital Improvements**

Other CIP projects scheduled for this fiscal year are the repaving of the two Municipal Parking Lots downtown completed last summer and replacing a failing Water Main under Rt 72 at Warner Rd.



#### **BUILDING IS BOOMING**

The new District 300 Elementary School on Big Timber in Hampshire continues to move quickly.



Challenged to complete the project in time for the 2022-2023 school year beginning August of 2022, Lamp Construction credits a tight but achievable construction schedule, and great weather for their progress

to this point.

The new Tamms Farm Subdivision on Big Timber west of Hampshire High School broke ground in August and has

completed initial mass grading. Lennar Homes the largest Home Builder in the U.S. purchased the subdivision from Crown Community Development earlier this year. Lennar is working closely with the Village of Hampshire and Hampshire High School Administrators to accommodate the needs of the High School and the future residents of the 182 home subdivision. Talks are aimed at providing safe and convenient pedestrian and vehicle access to and from Tamms Farm and Hampshire High School. The first homes are expected to be constructed in early 2022.

Crown Community Development kicked off the next phase of the Prairie Ridge Subdivision, to add 115 additional single family homes. With the first two neighborhoods in Prairie Ridge expected to be completed in 2022, this expansion to the north will keep the project moving forward, as demand for housing continues to be strong in Hampshire.

## Planning and Zoning Commission

#### **Meeting Efficiency and Cost Savings**

In May, the Village of Hampshire Board of Trustees approved the combining of the Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals, thus creating the Planning and Zoning Commission. The combining of these two groups streamlines issues for residents, builders and developers. It improves meeting efficiency and saves taxpayers' money without sacrificing the quality of review.

The Commission Conducts public hearings, makes recommendations to the Village Board of Trustees regarding the preliminary development plans, final development plans, zoning and special use of properties within the village, and also recommends variances of village ordinances.

Membership on the newly formed Planning and Zoning Commission is by appointment of the Village President with the approval of the Village Board of Trustees.

The Planning and Zoning Commission meets on as as-needed basis on the second and fourth Mondays of the month at Village Hall. The meetings are open to the public and all are welcome to attend.

## Hampshire In Top 10 Fastest Growing Illinois Communities

The 2020 census puts Hampshire (population 7,667) in the top 10 fastest growing communities in Illinois by percentage of population. Hampshire grew by almost 38% since the last census in 2010. The official increase in population is important for Hampshire because it determines the share of funds received from the State's Local Government Distributive Fund (higher population = larger share of the funds). This official increase will lead to more revenue in the Village's budget needed to continue to offer high-quality services.

The Village Board meets on the 1st and 3rd Thursday each month at 7pm at Village Hall, 234 S. State Street in Hampshire. Village Board Meetings are public, and residents are welcome to attend.
