Eagle Scout Honors Veterans and US Flag

Chris Taing of Hampshire, Illinois Troop 22 has completed the construction and placement of 3 flag collection boxes for his Eagle Scout project. He organized a team of 20 volunteers that consisted of family, members of Troop 22, and students from St. **Edward Catholic School** in Elgin. It took them 142 hours to construct and paint the boxes. To retire your old, worn, faded or torn flags, the boxes are located in the following locations:

Hampshire Village Hall: This box is dedicated to the memory of Joseph D. Troc who was drafted and served in the Vietnam War. He passed away due to illness caused by Agent Orange that was used to deforest the jungles of Vietnam.

Resource Bank: This box is dedicated to the memory of Edward J. Harn Jr. who volunteered and served during World War II and fought at the Battle of the Bulge. He was severely wounded and suffered disability to over 80% of his body.

First United Methodist Church: This box is

dedicated to the memory of Alvin V. Troc (Joseph Troc's father). He volunteered and served during World War II. He was a Japanese prisoner of war and had to eat the leather from his shoes to survive. When he returned, he weighed less than 100 pounds.

In addition to leading the

construction and painting of these boxes, a one-time collection and flag disposal education campaign was conducted. This resulted in over 100 flags being collected (over 400% of the goal) from communities outside of Hampshire. Participating communities included Libertyville, Elgin Chicago, Elburn, Bartlett, Joliet and Johnsburg. Over 1000 people were educated on where to go in the future to retire flags.

When asked why this project was important to him. Chris said that "this project was meaningful to me as it not only honored the veterans in my family, but all veterans. We must remember that the American Flag is not only a symbol of the gifts we enjoy in the United States, but also of those who have fallen protecting and ensuring



these blessings are there for future generations".

Chris would like personally thank the members of his troop who helped out (Keith Penkaty, Scott Marckini, Andy Potts, Adam Potts, Ernie Taing and Andrew Taing) as well as the representatives at each location where the boxes were placed: Mike Reid (Village Hall), Andy Potts Methodist (First United Church) and Caroline Toomey (Resource Bank).

LEAD SERVICE INSPECTION

Is your drinking water service line made of lead?

The village is required by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to find out what your service line is made of and document it. Village crews will be out placing door hangers on homesthat were built before 1986, asking to make an appointment to have village crews inspect the pipe coming into your home that feeds the water meter so as to identify what it's made of (Copper, Galvanized, Plastic, or Lead).

If your home was built before 1986, and you would like to make an appointment ahead of receiving a door hanger, call Sean Horne of Public Works at 224-605-1320 to schedule an appointment.

the Village's tornado sirens.

The lightning warning system sends out a 15-second blast when it detects conditions conducive for lightning, warning people to take cover. It sends out three 5-second blasts for the all-clear when lightning conditions are no longer detected.

Overnight Parking: Village ordinance allows overnight parking on the street from April 1st to November 1st.

Door-To-Door Soliciting: Village ordinance prohibits door-to-door soliciting. Report any violations to the Police Department.
