In today's world of Local Government Development, developers must provide new infrastructure to support their developments, funding millions of dollars of new roads, water and sewer infrastructure and water and sewer treatment facilities.


However, even infrastructure must be maintained and replaced over time. This is the financial obligation of the Village. Hamp-



shire now maintains a Capital Development Plan (CIP) available for review at www.hampshireil.org. The plan considers the cost of maintaining and replacing the Village's Capital Assets, including infrastructure, equipment, and buildings. The 2024-2026 CIP will include these costs as well as ways to fund these costs.

The Village's Capital Plan includes the financial planning necessary to keep our snowplows properly maintained, and to purchase new plows as we accept more miles of roads constructed by developers according to the Village specifications.

Now we must focus on a facility capable of housing this equipment and a place for our Public Works personnel to prepare for and manage plow and other operations efficiently and safely in all weather conditions. Finding a new source of revenue to fund a new 33,000-square-foot Public Works Facility at a cost of \$10 Million is the primary capital need in 2024. Water & Sewer infrastructure and equipment are a significant priority, as well.

A MESSAGE FROM MIKE REID
President, Village of Hampshire

State of the Village

I went to Springfield to attend the "State of the State" address in February and to meet with legislators about issues affecting Local Government. Our primary is avoiding mandates that require the village to implement new programs and regulations without providing funding. We must also protect the revenue sources that fund our day-to-day operating costs. Every year, the State takes a slightly larger piece of our pie. The Illinois Municipal League and the MetroWest Council of Governments monitor legislation throughout the year and inform us when bills affecting the Village are proposed. Then, we engage with our local legislators, asking them to represent our interests. While driving home from Springfield, I decided to devote this column to a brief "State of the Village" report.

2023 was a remarkable year for Hampshire; having completed Streetscape and several large infrastructure projects in 2022, we saw the impact in 2023, which will continue in 2024 and beyond.

New businesses have moved to downtown, and several more will open this spring. The Village annexed 400 acres of prime industrial and logistics property and updated the Prairie Ridge Residential Development to meet the needs of today's home buyers. These changes will provide for controlled, well-managed residential and industrial development for decades to come.

Like most Hampshire families, the Village still faces significant with costs for challenges, everything we buy rising with inflation putting pressure on our budget just like many of you. We have been successful in protecting our primary sources of operating income for day-to-day operations, including keeping your property taxes to the Village low. Remember, only 6 cents of each dollar you pay in property taxes comes to the Village. The other 94 cents goes to schools, the Park District, the Library District, the Township and the Fire Protection District. Capital to replace our decadesold public works building, water and sewer infrastructure, and equipment is a major challenge going forward. The Village created a Capital Improvement Program (CIP) in 2021 that summarizes these capital needs and costs. The current three-year CIP is available on the Village's website.

On the cover of this newsletter are details and pictures of our public works equipment and the 3,000 sf garage that houses only a fraction of our plows and equipment. It looks like trying to fit twenty

pounds of potatoes into a fivepound bag. Our challenge is to determine a new funding source to build a proper facility to store our plows during our cold winters, a place for our Plow Team to stage for major snow events, and from which to efficiently operate the many other duties of our Streets Department.

We have applied for State and Federal Grants, but many are designed for low-income communities, so Hampshire often does not qualify. During the next 60 days, the Village Budget Committee and Village Board of Trustees will consider how to fund the most crucial projects that must be funded before the costs increase further and to provide productive workspaces for our Village Employees. We welcome and encourage your input on these decisions.

The State of the Village of Hampshire Is good, but important decisions must be made in the coming months.
