### **Background**

J. Kraus serves as a crossing guard for the Village. She is an appointed employee of the Village and works under the supervision of the Police Department. She has applied for appointment to the position of member of the Board of Police Commissioners, where she would serve as one of three members charged with duties related to the appointment, discipline and dismissal of police officers in the Department.

### **Question Presented**

Whether it is a conflict of interests for a civilian employee working under the supervision of the Village Police Department to serve on the Board of Police Commissioners?

### Discussion

Ms. Kraus is appointed to the position of crossing guard by the Board of Trustees:

1-14-3: Other Employees of the Police Department:

Notwithstanding the powers of appointment of the Board of Police Commissioners, the President with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees may appoint police crossing guards, radio operators, desk attendants, and other clerical workers who may be employees of the Village, and who are not police officers, regardless of whether they shall wear a uniform or badge in the performance of their respective duties.

The Illinois Municipal Code provides for members of a Board of Police Commissioners, as follows:

65 ILCS 5/10-2.1-3 Qualifications - Oath - Bond - Removal

The members of the Board shall be considered officers of the municipality, and shall file an oath and a fidelity bond in such amount as may be required by the governing body of the municipality.

No person shall be appointed [to the Board of Police Commissioners]:

- 1. Who holds an office under a municipality.
- 2. Who has been convicted of a felony under the laws of this State or comparable laws of any other state or the United States.
- 3. Who is related, either by blood or marriage up to the degree of first cousin, to any elected official of such municipality.

No more than 2 members of the Board shall belong to the same political party existing in such municipality at the time of such appointments and as defined in Section 10-2 of The Election Code [10 ILCS 5/10-2].  $^1$ 

The applicant here appears to meets the general qualifications set out above, and no other state law or official policy has been found that would directly prohibit her from holding office as a member of the Board of Police Commissioners.

Please note that matters of this sort are determined not by the character of the person involved, but by the character of the office and the powers and duties incident to the office.<sup>2</sup> In the setting of "incompatibility of public offices," courts review the powers and duties of each office, and forbid holding two offices whenever there is a potential for overlap, or any possible effect of one office on the other. So, for example, a police officer may not hold the office of village trustee, where he would have powers and duties over budget, salaries, hiring/firing the Chief, staffing and such such decisions which would affect the Police Department. There does not seem to be such an incompatibility for a police board commissioner, where he/she has no authority over funding issues.

The other possible hurdle — given that the purpose of such a police commission is to remove partiality from hiring, discipline and dismissal decisions — would be that this appointment may call into question the impartiality of the Board when deciding matters of discipline or dismissal. That is, the Board would include an employee who is subject to supervision by the Chief of Police; and he/she would be deciding matters prosecuted by the Chief of Police against an officer. A person against whom charges have been brought by the Chief may feel (and may raise a legal issue) that such person could not be totally impartial in deciding the issues.

Note that in this instance the current Collective Bargaining Agreement for the police officers' union specifies that matters of discipline(for all officers below the rank of Sergeant) are to be handled by the Chief of Police and by grievance and arbitration procedures, and not via the Board of Police Commissioners. CBA, §10-9. Therefore, if appointed, Ms. Kraus would not be called upon to determine discipline for police officers. She would, however, be called upon to hear and decide

The Chief of Police has confirmed that affidavits of the various members of the BOPC are on file, and there is no disqualification of the current applicant on the basis of political affiliation.

matters of discipline regarding the Lieutenant and the Sergeants (and any supervisors or managerial employees) in the Department; and the issue of impartiality would arise in that setting.

### Action(s) Needed

- A. Consider the appointment of J. Kraus to the Board of Police Commissioners.
- B. Consider whether a person who works under the supervision of the Chief of Police should sit in judgment on matters of discipline or dismissal of the Lieutenant and/or Sergeants in the Police Department.

Dear Village President Magnussen and the Board of Trustees,

The Hampshire Township Park District is requesting that streets adjacent to our park property be designated as Park zones. Per Sec. 5/11-605.3 Special Traffic Protections While Passing Parks and Recreation Facilities and Areas, a "Park zone" means the recreation facilities and areas (including parking lots, bicycle paths, etc.) on any land owned or operated by a park district that are used for recreational purposes can be designated with a reduced speed limit with the standardized park zones and park zone streets. The local unit of government, by ordinance or resolution, can designate and approve the street or intersection as a park zone street.

The law states that on any day when children are present and within 50 feet of motorized traffic, a person may not drive a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of 20 miles per hour. Failing to come to a complete stop at a stop sign on a park zone street is also considered a violation of this Section.

Several streets where our parks are located are high traffic residential streets. Traffic studies would not warrant an additional stop sign at the intersection of Barn Owl Drive and Schmidt to allow children to cross the street safely to access the park. Seyller Park is used for tball and additional sports programs, and Little People Playtime preschool make this a frequently used park by the Park District as well as the residents. The future extension of Romke Road, the construction of a secondary road, and the overall park development with the lighted ballfield and dog park will make this a frequently used facility.

The Board of Commissioners is requesting the designation of Park zone at the following locations:

- Jefferson Ave. from the west entrance at Seyller Park to the east entrance of Little People Playtime
- Schmidt Drive and Barn Owl Drive adjacent to the Schmidt Park
- Romke Road south of The Park at Tuscany Woods and the future road on the west side of the park

Thank you for your consideration for the safety of the users of our parks in Hampshire.

Re: Hampshire Woods Discussion

To Whom It May Concern:

My Name is Michael Gazzola. I represent the Flannigan Venture Group in the sale of the last two remaining lots in the Hampshire Woods Business Park to Montemayor Construction. Joe Montemayor and I have been invited to attend your meeting on Thursday August 8, 2019 to review and discuss three items as Montemayor completes his due diligence. Those items are:

- 1. The Flannigan Road Right-Of-Way
- 2. The completion of the Cul-De-Sac on Flannigan Road
- 3. The Rezoning of the two lot to M2

I have provided exhibits to assist in our discussions. They are:

- 1. The ALTA/NSPS Land Title Survey dated July 6, 2019 for Parcel 1 a 10.163-acre site.
- The ALTA/NSPS Land Title Survey dated June 24, 2019 for Lot 9 a 4.132-acre site.
- 3. The Hampshire Woods Business Park Unit 1 Plat of Subdivision dated June 24, 2003.
- 4. The Higgins Road Realignment/Proposed Roadway Layout prepared by EEI dated July 2006.

Our discussions would focus on the retention or elimination of the remaining Flannigan Road ROW and the ultimate contribution of the land required for the Higgins Road realignment. We propose to eliminate the ROW. In doing so Montemayor would contribute 1.4 acres to the Higgins Road realignment at the north end of Parcel 1 and would receive the 1.2-acre easement/ROW with the elimination of that easement/ROW. This would provide land for the future Higgins Road realignment and provide Montemayor a deeper 8-acre lot to develop along Rt.20. He would also require an entrance point at the northwest corner of Parcel 1 for future ingress and egress.

The current Cul-De-Sac was constructed as a temporary easement in 2004. The sale of the last two lots in the Park and the development of Parcel 1 warrants the upgrade and completion of that part of Flannigan Road.

Finally, as we complete the ROW and Cul-De Sac direction, we will make application to rezone the two lots from OM to M2. This will allow a broader spectrum of use and will match the work we have done in 2018 on the surrounding parcels.



### AN ORDINANCE

### AMENDING THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION FROM M-1 RESTRICTED INDUSTRIAL ZONING DISTRICT TO M-2 GENERAL INDUSTRIAL ZONING DISTRICT FOR CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE VILLAGE (Houston Parkway LLC – Allen Road Property)

WHEREAS, Houston Parkway, LLC has filed a Petition for Zoning Amendment for certain property legally described as set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Subject Property"), and located at 46W704 Allen Road in the Village, to amend the zoning classification of the Subject Property from M-1 Restricted Industrial Zoning District to M-2 Restricted Industrial Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, TRZ intends to develop the premises for warehouse and distribution uses; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the Petition for Zoning Amendment was commenced by the Zoning Board of Appeals on Tuesday, April 9, 2019, and resumed and concluded on May 14, 2019, pursuant to notice published in the Daily Herald Newspaper on March 18, 2019; and

WHEREAS, following the public hearing, the Zoning Board of Appeals rendered certain Findings of Fact and made a recommendation that the Petition for Zoning Amendment be disapproved; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities, having considered the Petition, the record of the public hearing, and the Findings of Fact and Recommendation of the Zoning Board of Appeals, have determined that it is advisable that the Petition for Zoning Amendment be approved.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Petition for Zoning Amendment filed by Houston Parkway, LLC, concerning the property legally described on the attached Exhibit "A," to amend the zoning classification for the Subject Property from M-1 Restricted Industrial Zoning District to M-2 General Industrial Zoning District, shall be and is hereby approved.

Section 2. Any and all ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, which are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of any such conflict, hereby superseded and waived.

Section 3. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE REGULATIONS FOR REGISTRATION OF VIDEO GAMING TERMINALS TO BE PLACED OR LOCATED IN THE VILLAGE

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois General Assembly has amended the regulations governing the placing, location and operation of video gaming terminals throughout the State, including in the Village, Illinois Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/5-1-1 et seq. (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, under the Act, video gaming terminals may be placed in any of the following establishments: local establishments holding a valid state liquor license; a licensed truck stop; a licensed large truck stop; a licensed fraternal organization, or a licensed veterans organization; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it necessary and advisable to recognize the addition of a large truck stop establishment for purposes of registering video gaming terminals in the Village. and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Gaming Board otherwise has jurisdiction over and supervision of all gaming operations governed by the Act.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as previously amended, shall be and is hereby further amended to add "large truck stop" to the list of facilities that must register video gaming terminals to be placed, located, operated in the Village, in accordance with the provisions of the Illinois Video Gaming Act, 230 ILCS 40/5-1-1 et seq., in words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER 4

**BUSINESS REGULATIONS** 

ARTICLE 23

VIDEO GAMING

SECTION 4-23-2:

REGISTRATION REQUIRED.

- A. The owner of any video gaming location in the Village shall be required to register each video gaming terminal to be placed at such location.
- B. For each video gaming terminal to be located in the Village, an application for registration shall be filed by the following, as may be applicable:

- The holder of the liquor license for the premises of a 1. licensed establishment:
- An authorized representative of a licensed truck stop; 2.
- An authorized representative of a licensed large truck stop; 3.
- An authorized representative of the licensed fraternal 3. organization:
- An authorized representative of the licensed veteran's 4. organization.
- The Village Clerk shall provide a form for such application, and the applicant shall provide in full such information as is requested by the Village on such form.
- All ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict Section 3. with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded and waived.
- Section 4. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.
