ABATING THE VILLAGE PORTION OF REAL ESTATE TAXES
LEVIED FOR THE YEAR 2015 (COLLECTABLE IN 2016) ON CERTAIN
PROPERTY LOCATED WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE
(The Northern Builders Property – PIN 01-11-100-016)**

WHEREAS, on September 4, 2014, the Corporate Authorities of the Village approved a certain agreement with the owner of Parcel No. 01-11-100-016 (the "Subject Property") for development of the parcel and other matters related thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Owner of the Subject Property agreed to develop the parcel in part with a new industrial building; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement specifically provided as follows:

The Village shall abate the ad valorem real estate taxes for the Village otherwise levied on the Subject Property for a period of three (3) years commencing in regard to taxes to be assessed in 2015 and ending in regard to taxes to be assessed in 2017.

WHEREAS, the Agreement further provides that the Owner shall be allowed to divide the Subject Property into two separate parcels, with the understanding that the taxes shall be abated for each resulting parcel; and

WHEREAS, the abatement of taxes on the Property is due for the 2015 tax year (collectable in 2016).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The portion of ad valorem real estate taxes due to the Village, including the portion due for Village pension purposes, for PIN: 01-11-100-016 (the "Property") shall be and are hereby abated in their entirety for the tax year 2015 (collectable in 2016).

Section 2. The County Clerk shall abate the portion of the total ad valorem real estate taxes on the Property that is due to the Village of Hampshire, including the portion due for Village pension purposes, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 3. The abatement authorized by this Ordinance shall apply to the Property under its current Property Index Number (the "PIN") and any changes in the

PIN and to any additional tax parcels resulting from a division of the Subject Property by the Owner.

Section 4. Forthwith upon the adoption of this Ordinance, the Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy hereof with the County Clerk of Kane County.

Section 5. Any motion, order, resolution or ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance is to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and waived.

Section 6. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

ABATING TAXES LEVIED FOR THE 2015 TAX YEAR (COLLECTABLE
IN 2016) TO PAY DEBT SERVICE ON THE \$1,400,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION
BONDS - SERIES 2009A (ALTERNATE REVENUE SOURCE) FOR THE
VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village, by Ordinance No. 06-13, adopted on the 20th day of April, 2006 provided for the future issuance of not to exceed \$3,000,000.00 General Obligation Bonds, for the purpose of funding certain public improvements in the Village, including roadway and sanitary sewer improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village, by Ordinance No. 09-17, adopted on the 14th day of May, 2009, and pursuant to the initial authorization set forth in said Ordinance No. 06-13, thereafter authorized and provided for the issuance of a portion of the total of said bonds, to wit: \$1,400,000.00 General Obligation Bonds – Series 2009A (Alternate Revenue Source), for the purpose of funding certain public improvements in the Village, including roadway improvements, and provided for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay principal and interest and other proper expense on said Bonds; and

WHEREAS, said bonds are by the terms of the Ordinance to be payable from certain monies, to wit: all municipal utility taxes on electricity and gas imposed pursuant to Division 11 of Article 8 of the Municipal Code (the "Pledged Revenues"), and, in the alternative, if necessary, from ad valorem taxes levied against taxable property within the Village; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 09-17 included in its terms a levy of taxes for payment of principal and interest coming due during the period from May 1, 2015 to April 30, 2016 ("Fiscal Year 2016"); and

WHEREAS, the Village has accumulated or will have accumulated sufficient Pledged Revenues, as defined in Ordinance No. 09-17, available for the purpose of paying said debt service; and

WHEREAS, the Village is authorized to abate certain taxes when it is determined that sufficient funds are available from any other source which lawfully may be applied to payment of its obligations.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Corporate Authorities of the Village of Hampshire adopt the recitals set forth above, and hereby direct the application of the Pledged Revenues

in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest due to be paid during Fiscal Year 2016 arising out of the \$1,400,000 General Obligation Bonds – Series 2009A (Alternate Revenue Source).

Section 2. The County Clerk is hereby directed to abate in its entirety the tax levy for the 2015 tax year (taxes collectable in 2016) for the \$1,400,000 General Obligation Bonds – Series 2009A (Alternate Revenue Source), as set out in Bond Ordinance No. 09-17, previously certified to the County Clerk.

Section 3. Forthwith upon the adoption of this Ordinance, the Village Clerk shall file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the County Clerk of Kane County, Illinois.

Section 4. Any motion, order, resolution, or ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance is to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and waived.

Section 5. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

(The Elgiloy Property – PIN 01-02-105-002)**

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village, by Ordinance No. 97-9, adopted on April 17, 1997, approved the annexation of certain territory to the Village as identified therein; and

WHEREAS, said territory was annexed to the Village pursuant to the terms and conditions of a certain Annexation Agreement, duly approved by the Board of Trustees, and by the property owner, and thereafter recorded as Doc. No. 1997 K 27230 in the Office of the Kane County Recorder; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement provided as follows:

Conditions for Abatement of Real Estate Taxes. Village agrees to abate the real estate taxes otherwise due and payable by Owner on the Property, on the following terms and conditions: Village shall abate said taxes in an amount not to exceed \$160,000.00; and Village shall each year after the date of this Agreement, enact such ordinance or ordinances as shall be necessary to abate said taxes, for such year or years, and in such respective amounts, as shall be necessary to aggregate said total amount. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that Owner is leasing the Property to a manufacturing concern which is expanding its Illinois operation, and this agreement to abate real estate taxes is made pursuant to the Illinois Revenue Code, 35 ILCS 200/18-165.

WHEREAS, the abatement of taxes on the Property is due for the coming year, neither the total number of years allowed by the Illinois Revenue Code having expired, nor the total amount called for in the annexation agreement having been abated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The portion of ad valorem real estate taxes due to the Village, including the portion due for Village pension purposes, for PIN: 01-02-105-002, (the "Property") which is the part of the territory annexed by Ordinance No. 97-9 devoted to manufacturing use (known as the Elgiloy Specialty Metals facility), and owned by Combined Metals of Chicago, LLC, shall be and is hereby abated in its entirety for the tax year 2015 (collectable in 2016).

Section 2. The County Clerk shall abate the portion of the total ad valorem real estate taxes on the Property that is due to the Village of Hampshire, including the portion due for Village pension purposes, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Forthwith upon the adoption of this Ordinance, the Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy hereof with the County Clerk of Kane County.

Section 4. Any motion, order, resolution or ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance is to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and waived.

ABATING SPECIAL TAXES LEVIED FOR THE 2015 TAX YEAR
(COLLECTABLE IN 2016) TO PAY DEBT SERVICE ON THE SPECIAL
SERVICE AREA BONDS ISSUED FOR SPECIAL SERVICE AREA # 14
IN THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

WHEREAS, the Village has previously issued certain Special Service Area Special Tax Bonds, for its Special Service Area No. 14, pursuant to its Ordinance No. 06-12, enacted on June 20, 2006; and

WHEREAS, said bonds were issued in the amount of \$12,000,000 and labeled Special Service Area Number 14 ("SSA 14"), Special Tax Bonds, Series 2006 (Lakewood Crossing Subdivision Project); and

WHEREAS, by its Ordinance No. 06-12, identified above, and further, by its Ordinance No. 14-51, the Village levied certain special taxes against the properties located in Special Service Area No. 14 in order to pay principal and interest coming due on said bonds; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the special taxes previously levied may be abated as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES, OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The taxes previously levied in Ordinance No. 06-12 and/or in Ordinance No. 14-51 for the 2015 Tax Year (to be collected in 2016) shall be and hereby are abated in an amount equal to \$127,876.64.

Section 2. The County Clerk shall be and is hereby directed to abate, from the amount originally levied for special taxes for Special Service Area No. 14, for 2015 (collectable in 2016), to wit: \$981,984.00 (as set forth in said ordinances), an amount equal to \$127,876.64, leaving a balance of special taxes to be levied for 2015 (collectable in 2016) equal to \$854,107.36 (as set forth in Ordinance No. 15-38).

Section 3. The Village Clerk shall promptly upon its adoption file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the County Clerk of Kane County, Illinois.

**AN ORDINANCE
AMENDING THE REGULATIONS OF THE VILLAGE
CODE REGARDING SOLICITORS AND PEDDLERS**

WHEREAS, the Village has previously adopted various regulations governing the licensing and the activities of solicitors and peddlers in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it necessary and advisable to modify said regulations at this time.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as amended, shall be and is hereby further amended to modify the regulations governing the licensing and the activities of peddlers in the Village, in words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER	POLICE REGULATIONS
ARTICLE IV	SOLICITORS

4-3-1: DEFINITION:

"Solicitor" shall mean any person, firm or business entity, who for itself, or by its agents, employees, or servants, without any prior appointment or pre-arrangement with the customer, offers, asks for and/or takes orders for future delivery at retail of any merchandise or other article or thing whatsoever, or any service, not ordered by telephone, computer link, or other remote communication.

The term "solicitor" shall include any person, firm or business entity, who for itself or by its agents, employees, or servants, from a fixed location or by going from place to place, without any prior appointment or pre-arrangement with the customer, asks for donations of money or tangible personal property for any commercial, educational, political, patriotic, philanthropic, religious, or other not-for-profit entity or enterprise.

4-3-2: EXEMPTION FROM DEFINITION.

The definition of solicitor shall not include those persons who distribute religious or political literature or materials, and/or who seek to engage in discussion of religious or political topics or issues, and/or who ask

for donations or contributions for religious or political causes, from a fixed location or by going door-to-door or place-to-place or street-to-street; provided, except for the prohibition of Section 4-3-3(A), the prohibitions otherwise set forth in Section 4-3-3 below shall apply to such persons.

4-3-3: PROHIBITED CONDUCT:

A. It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to go from house to house, place to place or street to street in the village.

B. It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to cheat or deceive any person in the village; or to fraudulently misrepresent the quality, price or amount of any goods, wares, merchandise, article or thing, or service, for which orders are taken in the village; or to fraudulently misrepresent the purpose of any solicitation, or the person, firm or entity to be benefited thereby; or to misrepresent that a donor will be eligible for a tax deduction for any donation or contribution solicited.

C. Any solicitor, upon arriving at any private property on which has conspicuously posted a sign, "No Solicitors", or a substantially similar sign, shall immediately and peacefully depart from the premises, and it shall be unlawful for such solicitor to remain on the property.

D. Any solicitor who has entered onto any private property, whether invited thereon or not, shall immediately and peacefully depart therefrom when requested to do so by the occupant, and it shall be unlawful for such solicitor to remain on the property after such request.

E. No person shall engage in the business of solicitor prior to nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. and later than eight o'clock (8:00) P.M.

F. Any solicitor shall at all times conduct himself or herself in accordance with this code, local ordinances, state and federal laws and regulations, and no solicitor shall violate any such code, ordinances, laws or regulations.

4-3-4: PENALTY:

Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be subject to penalty as provided in section 12-1-13 of this code. Each day that any offense shall continue shall constitute a separate offense

Section 2: The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as amended, shall be and is hereby further amended to modify the regulations governing the licensing and the activities of peddlers in the Village, in words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER 2	POLICE REGULATIONS
ARTICLE V	PEDDLERS

4-5-1: DEFINITION:

"Peddler" shall mean any person, firm, or business entity who, for itself, or by its agents, employees, or servants, with only a temporary location for doing business and not intending to establish a permanent place for such business in the Village, sells at retail, offers for sale, sells and delivers, barter or exchanges any goods, wares, merchandise, or any other article or thing whatsoever, or any service not ordered by telephone, computer link, or other remote communication.

The term "peddler" shall include persons who will engage in the activities described in this section during any festival, fair, trade show, exposition, flea market, or like event to be held within the Village.

4-5-2: PROHIBITED CONDUCT:

A. It shall be unlawful for any peddler to go from house to house, place to place, or street to street in the village, provided, this prohibition shall not apply to persons who make regular sales or deliveries of goods or services by prior agreement with the occupant of any property, house or other place in the Village.

B. It shall be unlawful for any peddler to cheat or deceive any person in the village, or to fraudulently misrepresent the quality, price or amount of the goods, wares, merchandise, article or thing, or service sold, offered for sale, sold and delivered, bartered or exchanged, including promise of any refund without providing a written statement of the refund terms and conditions.

C. Any peddler, upon arriving upon any private property on which has conspicuously posted a sign, "No Peddlers", or substantially similar sign, shall refrain from entering and/or immediately and peacefully depart from the premises, and it shall be unlawful for such peddler to remain on the property.

D. Any peddler who has entered onto any private property, whether invited thereon or not, shall immediately and peacefully depart therefrom when requested to do so by the occupant, and it shall be unlawful for such peddler to remain on the property after such request.

E. No person shall engage in the business of peddler prior to nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. and later than eight o'clock (8:00) P.M. on any day or outside the hours of peddling activities allowed by his or her peddler's license, if different.

F. Any peddler shall at all times conduct himself or herself in accordance with this code, local ordinances, state and federal laws and regulations, and no peddler shall violate any such code, ordinances, laws or regulations.

4-5-3: PENALTY:

Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be subject to penalty as provided in section 12-1-3 of this code. Each day that any offense shall exist or continue shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3. Any and all ordinances, resolutions, motions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this Ordinance, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and waived.

Section 4. If any section, sentence, subdivision, or phrase of this Ordinance, shall be held to be void, invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, according to law.

**AN ORDINANCE
AMENDING THE LIQUOR REGULATIONS OF
THE VILLAGE CODE REGARDING OFFENSES WHICH MAY
BE COMMITTED BY A LICENSEE OR BY ANY OTHER PERSON**

WHEREAS, the Village has previously adopted certain regulations governing the sale and service of alcohol beverages in the Village; and

WHEREAS, said regulations describe certain offenses which might be committed by license holders and others in regard to the possession, sale, and/or consumption of alcohol beverages; and

WHEREAS it is prohibited in the State of Illinois for a person under the age of twenty-one (21) to possess or consume alcohol beverages; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it necessary and advisable to re-state in the liquor control regulations the offenses which may be committed by a licensee and offenses which may be committed by any other person, including but not limited to such possession or consumption by a minor within the Village.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Hampshire Municipal Code of 1985, as amended, shall be and hereby is further amended to re-state the offenses which might be committed by the holder of a liquor license, and offenses which might be committed by others, including specifically possession or consumption of alcohol liquor by a minor in the Village, words and figures as follows:

CHAPTER 3	BUSINESS REGULATIONS
ARTICLE I	ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR
SECTION 3-1-17	OFFENSES BY LICENSEE

No licensee under the provisions of this Chapter shall for himself or herself, or through his or her agents or employees, do any of the following:

A. General:

1. Make any sale of alcoholic liquor in violation of the authority granted the licensee pursuant to this Chapter or in violation of the laws of the state.

2. Sell or possess for sale any package containing alcoholic liquor unless the same shall have affixed thereto all canceled revenue stamps which may be required by law.

B. Minors and Others:

1. Sell alcoholic liquor to any person who is under the age of 21 years.
 - a. Whenever the holder of a liquor license issued by the Village, or any of his or her agents or employees, believes, has reason to believe, or reasonably should have had reason to believe that a sale or delivery of any alcoholic liquor is prohibited because of the age of the prospective recipient, he or she shall, before making such sale or delivery, demand from such prospective recipient presentation of an identification document, such as a driver's license, containing proof of age, and issued by a public officer in the performance of his or her official duties.
2. Sell alcohol liquor to any intoxicated person, habitual drunkard, or insane, feeble-minded or distracted person.
3. Employ or permit the employment of any minor in his place of business except in connection with activities not related to the sale or delivery of alcoholic liquors.
4. Permit any person under the age of 21 years to sell, possess, or give away any alcoholic liquor on the premises for which such license is issued.
5. Permit any person under the age of twenty one (21) years to remain on the premises of any licensee; provided, the prohibition of this sub-section shall not apply to:
 - a. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older, when such person is on the premises pursuant to employment; or
 - b. Any person accompanied by his or her parent, legal guardian or spouse; or
 - c. Premises where food is sold, except in any area segregated and designated principally for the sale or consumption of alcoholic liquor; or
 - d. Bowling alleys, except in any area segregated and designated principally for the sale or consumption of alcoholic liquor.

C. Premises and Public Areas:

1. Harbor or permit any intoxicated persons to loiter on the premises described in the license, or permit any conduct which tends to disturb the peace or quiet of the neighborhood or the premises.
2. Serve any alcoholic beverage to any person for consumption on public streets or to any persons in motor vehicles on such streets.
3. Permit any person to consume any alcoholic liquor on the premises described in the license unless such alcoholic liquor has been purchased on the premises.
4. Keep open for business or admit any person other than an employee who is then performing services during the hours within which the sale of such liquor is prohibited; or to permit or allow any person, other than an employee then performing services, to remain in or about the licensed premises either before or after the hours designated within which the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquors is prohibited on the licensed premises.
 - a. Provided, however, that grocery stores, convenience stores which operate on a twenty four (24) hour basis, restaurants, clubs, hotels, and motels may keep their places of business open subject only to the provisions that no sale at retail of alcoholic liquors or the consumption by patrons or customers or by the public of alcoholic liquors shall be permitted or allowed on said licensed premises during the hours prohibited; and
 - b. Further provided that employees may remain in or about the licensed premises either one hour before or after the hours designated within which the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor is prohibited on the licensed premises for the sole purpose of conducting business related activities such as cleaning and inventory, expressly subject to the provision that no sale at retail of alcoholic liquors or the consumption by any persons of alcoholic liquor shall be permitted or allowed on said licensed premises during the hours prohibited.
5. Sell alcoholic liquor at any time other than during the service hours established in this Chapter.
6. Permit any window display of liquor or other decoration of such a nature as will obstruct the view into the interior from the exterior.

7. Serve or permit any person to consume any alcoholic liquor in any curtained enclosure, or any rear or side room, or in any place on the premises not accessible to view from the exterior.

D. Other Offenses:

1. Sell any items of intimate apparel, including lingerie, undergarments, sleepwear or swimsuits;
 2. Permit any card playing, game of chance, or gambling on the premises, except as otherwise allowed by the Illinois Video Gaming Act, 230 Illinois Compiled Statutes 40/5-1-1 et seq., as now in effect or as hereafter amended.
- E. Any person who violates the provisions of this Section shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

CHAPTER 3	BUSINESS REGULATIONS
ARTICLE I	ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR
SECTION 3-1-18	OFFENSES BY PERSONS OTHER THAN LICENSEE

A. Except as otherwise permitted by this Section:

1. No person under 21 years of age shall purchase, accept delivery of, or have possession of any alcoholic liquor.
 2. No person under 21 years of age shall consume any alcoholic liquor.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of twenty one (21) years to misrepresent his or her age, or the age of another, orally or by presentation of a false identification document, for the purpose of inducing any licensee under this Chapter to sell or give such minor any alcoholic liquor in violation of this Chapter, or for the purpose of purchasing or obtaining alcoholic liquor in any place in the Village where alcoholic liquor is sold.
- C. No person shall transfer, alter, or deface any identification document; use the identification document(s) of another; carry or use a false or forged identification document; or obtain an identification document by means of false information.

- D. The possession, dispensing, or consumption of alcoholic liquor by a person under 21 years of age in the performance of a religious service or ceremony, or the consumption of alcoholic liquor by a person under 21 years of age under the direct supervision and approval of the parents or parent, or of those persons standing in loco parentis of such person under 21 years of age, in the privacy of a home, is not prohibited by this Section.
- E. The provisions of this Section prohibiting the possession of alcoholic liquor by a person under 21 years of age and dispensing of alcoholic liquor to a person under 21 years of age do not apply in the case of a student under 21 years of age, but 18 years of age or older:
 - 1. Who is enrolled as a student in a college, university, or post-secondary educational institution that is accredited or certified by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education or a nationally recognized accrediting agency or association, or that has a permit of approval issued by the Board of Higher Education pursuant to the Illinois Private Business and Vocational Schools Act of 2012; and
 - 2. Who is participating in a culinary arts, food service, or restaurant management degree program of which a portion of the program includes instruction on responsible alcoholic beverage serving methods modeled after the Beverage Alcohol Sellers and Server Education and Training (BASSET) curriculum; and
 - 3. Who tastes, but does not imbibe, alcoholic liquor only during times of a regularly scheduled course while under the direct supervision of an instructor who is at least 21 years of age and employed by an educational institution described in sub-section (b); and
 - 4. Who tastes, but does not imbibe, alcoholic liquor for instructional purposes up to, but not exceeding, 6 times per class as a part of a required course in which the student temporarily possesses alcoholic liquor for tasting, not imbibing, purposes only in a class setting on the campus of such educational institution, and, thereafter, the alcoholic liquor is possessed and remains under the control of the instructor.
- F. It shall be unlawful for any minor to remain on the premises of any licensee under this Chapter, including in any room or compartment adjoining or adjacent to or situated in the place where alcoholic liquor is sold in the Village, except as otherwise permitted in Section 3-1-17 above.

- G. It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale any items of intimate apparel including lingerie, undergarments, sleepwear or swimsuits on any premises licensed for sale of alcoholic liquor in the Village.
- H. It shall be unlawful for any intoxicated person or habitual drunkard to purchase any alcoholic liquor in the Village.
- I. No person shall transport, carry, possess or have any alcoholic liquor within the passenger area of any motor vehicle, except in the original package and with the seal unbroken.
 - 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, a restaurant licensed to sell alcoholic liquor may permit a patron to remove one (1) unsealed and partially consumed bottle of wine for off-premise consumption provided that the patron has purchased a meal and consumed a portion of the bottle of wine with the meal on the restaurant premises.
 - a. A partially consumed bottle of wine that is to be removed from the premises pursuant to this section shall be securely sealed by the licensee or an agent of the licensee prior to removal from the premises and placed in a transparent one-time use tamperproof bag.
 - b. The licensee or agent of the licensee shall provide a dated receipt for the bottle of wine to the patron.
 - c. A person who is transporting a bottle of wine that has been resealed in accordance with the provisions of this Section and not tampered with and transported in accordance with the restrictions of subsections (a) and (b) of Section 11-502 of the Illinois Vehicle Code shall not be deemed to be in violation of this Section.
- J. Any person who violates the provisions of this Section shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

Section 2. All ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded and waived.

Section 3. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form, as provided by law.

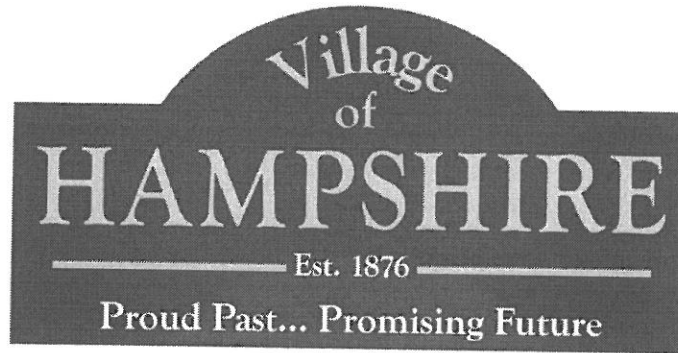

RE: Pothole Policy

Background. Potholes are prevalent at this time of year with ice, snow and freezing rain taking a toll on the Village roadways and alleys especially as pavement ages. The Village mobilizes the Street Maintenance crews as quickly as possible to make the necessary repairs but at times residents or others experience damage to property and/or person.

Analysis. Staff has worked to draft the attached policy to acknowledge the Village's responsibility and the requirements necessary to gain reimbursement for damage that is the result of a pothole.

Recommendation. Staff recommends adoption the attached policy.

POTHOLE POLICY**

Potholes form when water or moisture seeps into the pavement, freezes and causes the pavement to expand and push up. When the temperature starts to rise above freezing, the ice which formed under the pavement melts and causes cracks. Vehicles that drive over the cracks can cause the pavement to break and rise.

When the Public Works Department becomes aware of a pothole, they do the following:

In the winter, only 'cold patch' is available for asphalt plants, so crews will fill the hole with asphalt and tamp it down. This is a temporary repair until warmer weather and 'hot mix' asphalt is available.

In the warmer months (approximately April thru November), crews will fill small potholes and tamp the asphalt into place. For larger potholes, they will sawcut an area to be repaved as a larger patch.

The Village cannot inspect all roadways all the time, and it is possible for a pothole to go unnoticed for a matter of weeks or even months depending on how well travelled a roadway or alley is.

When the Street Department receives a report of a pothole, it has five (5) working days to patch the pothole unless weather conditions or other constraints prevent the pothole from being patched that quickly.

The Village does not repair potholes on State, County or Township owned roadways or the Tollway.

Claims:

If you would like to file a claim to seek reimbursement from the Village, please first read this entire policy to determine if your claim is plausible. The Village of Hampshire cannot assume responsibility/liability for damage caused by weather related events/conditions, damages caused by other vehicles/motorists, or unreported road debris or conditions.

In order to file an insurance claim, a police report MUST be filed with the Village of Hampshire Police Department. The report must be prepared before any damage is repaired and the driver must be able to prove that the damage was caused by a pothole that had already been determined to need repair. You can call 630-232-8400 for the Police Department dispatch that will send a patrol officer to your location. You will need to have the following information available for the Police Report:

- Driver Information including name, address, phone number, date of birth, and driver's license
- Vehicle Information including make-model-year of vehicle, license plate number, Vehicle Identification Number (VIN), and name and address of owner of owner is not the driver
- Insurance Information including name of company, policy number, and expiration date

To make a claim, contact the Village of Hampshire Finance Department at 847-683-2240, extension 25.

The following information will need to be provided to the Village to be able to properly review the claim:

- Police Report
- Pothole Location (by intersection or address, side of the road, etc.)
- Picture of vehicle specific damage
- Two Repair Estimates

The Village evaluates each claim based upon standards set forth by Illinois Court of Claims and the Tory Immunity Act. Under the Act, willful and wanton negligence is needed to be found against the Village. The Village must be given prior notice of a condition and be allowed an adequate length of time to repair the condition. The Village cannot accept responsibility for incidents where direct liability is not clear or for circumstances outside of the control the Village. Please note, response time could be extended in the event of severe weather or other circumstances.

For State owned roadways, contact the Illinois Department of Transportation at 800-452-4368.

For County owned roadways, Contact the Kane County Division of Transportation at 630-584-1170.

For Township owned roadways, Contact the Hampshire Township Highway Commissioner at 847-683-4485.

For the Tollway, dial *999 while driving on the tollway to report a pothole.
