EEI Job #: HA1118

EEI has reviewed the bids that were opened on January 25, 2018. The bids were structured in a way that gave the Village flexibility to choose the exterior coating option based on the bidder's cost. Jetco, LTD was the low bidder on the base bid and each of the alternates. (See attached bid tabulation.)

Below is a summary of the pros and cons for each alternate. Alternate 1 and 1A are combined due to the fact that the roof antenna pod may need to be removed in order to install the containment system necessary for Alternate 1 (full blast and repaint). Both Alternates 2 and 3 are coating systems that will be applied over the existing coating on the tank. Alternate 4 is an insulative coating applied to the underside of the bowl and to the access tube in the interior dry parts of the tank.

Please note that the required work inside the tank does not vary and will be the same regardless of the exterior option chosen. Prices represent the low bidder's total construction cost (Base bid + Alternate).

Alternates 1 and 1A: Full Blast Exterior with Containment, Fluoropolymer Coating System (\$431,050.00)

- Pros
 - Longest life expectancy for the coating system, 25+ years
 - o Best color/gloss retention
- Cons
 - Most expensive
 - o Extends the tank downtime by approximately 45 days. This could be mitigated if they install part of the containment while the tank is online.
 - Extra coordination is required with Fox Valley Internet and KaneComm to remove their equipment from the roof pod if it is determined that the contractor will have to remove the roof pod in order to install the containment.



Alternate 2: Spot Repair Exterior without Containment, Polyurethane Coating System (\$297,900.00)

- Pros
 - o Long life expectancy for the coating system, 15+years
 - Can be done without a containment system
- Cons
 - Second most expensive
 - Risk of overspray on neighboring properties without a containment system.

Alternate 3: Spot Repair Exterior without Containment, Dry Fall Coating System (\$275,250.00)

- Pros
 - Least expensive
 - o Can be done without a containment system
 - Minimal risk of overspray on neighboring properties
- Cons
 - Lowest life expectancy, 10+ years
 - o Least color retention

Alternate 4: Insulative Coating in the part of the interior dry (\$44.900.00 Alternate cost only)

- Pros
 - Insulative coating prevents condensation from forming on the interior dry of the bowl and access tube of the tank.
 - Protects the interior dry coatings and extends the life expectancy of the coating.
- Cons
 - o An expensive option to increase the life expectancy of the coating.

RECOMMENDATION:

EEI's recommendation is as follows:

- Award the base bid plus Alternate 2, this provides an extended life expectancy of the coating system for a minimal increase in cost over Alternate 3.
- EEI does not recommend awarding Alternate 4. The cost for this alternate does not make it an economical choice for the benefits it provides.

ACTION REQUIRED:

Village concurrence with EEI's recommendation.

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A THIRD AMENDMENT TO THE ANNEXATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE AND HAMPSHIRE WEST, LLC, ET AL.

(Re Annexation Agreement / Crown Developments / April 14, 2005)

WHEREAS, a written proposal submitted by Hampshire East, LLC on behalf of the owners of the property in question (the "Owners"), and regarding the territory described therein, was filed with the Clerk of the Village of Hampshire, Kane County, Illinois, proposing a Third Amendment to the Annexation Agreement previously entered into in regard to the Crown Developments, said Agreement being dated April 14, 2005, and having been recorded as Doc. No. 2005K44725 in the Office of the Kane County Recorder; and

WHEREAS, the Owners have proposed to modify the Annexation Agreement to allow for an additional interim use, to wit: a composting facility, to be located on the part of the subject property designated as Oakstead; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice published in the Daily Herald newspaper on December 27, 2017, a public hearing concerning the proposed Third Amendment to the Annexation Agreement was conducted before the Village Board of Trustees on January 18, 2018, and the statutory requirements provided in Section 11-15.1-1 et seq. of the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended, have been fully met; and

WHEREAS, following said public hearing, the terms and provisions of such Third Amendment have been concluded and finalized between the parties, in accordance with 65 ILCS 5/11-15.1-4; and

WHEREAS, the Owners of said property are ready, willing and able to enter into said Amendment and to perform the obligations required thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities deem it to be in the best interests of the Village to approve such Third Amendment to the Annexation Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Corporate Authorities of the Village hereby approve the "Third Amendment to Annexation Agreement," by and between Hampshire West LLC, and Hampshire East, LLC, and the Village, and relating to the property legally described in said Amendment; a true and accurate copy of said Third Amendment to Annexation Agreement is attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference.

THIRD AMENDMENT TO ANNEXATION AGREEMENT

This THIRD AMENDMENT TO ANNEXATION AGREEMENT (referred to herein as the "Third Amendment") is made and entered into as of the ____ day of ________, 2018 by and between the VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, ILLINOIS, an Illinois municipal corporation (the "Village"), by and through its President and Board of Trustees (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "Corporate Authorities"), and HAMPSHIRE EAST LLC, an Illinois limited liability company, and HAMPSHIRE WEST, LLC, (sometimes referred to herein collectively as "Developer").

WITNESS:

WHEREAS, the Village and Developer are parties to that certain Annexation Agreement dated April 14, 2005 recorded in the Office of the Kane County Recorder as Document No. 2005K047722 (the "Original Agreement") which was amended by a First Amendment to Annexation Agreement dated May 14, 2007 by and between the Village, Developer and others recorded in the Office of the Kane Country Recorder as Document No. 2007K072733 (the "First Amendment") and which was further amended by a Second Amendment to Annexation Agreement dated September 2, 2010 and recorded in the Office of the Kane County Recorder as Doc. No. 2010K058910 (the Original Annexation Agreement, as amended by the First Amendment and by the Second Amendment, is collectively referred to as the "Annexation Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, Developer owns the land described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto which is comprised of the lands in the community known as the Oakstead Community (herein referred to as the "Subject Property") which along with certain other lands was annexed to the Village

pursuant to the Annexation Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Owner desires to establish an interim use on that portion of the Subject Property in the Oakstead Community described on Exhibit "B," attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, for a composting business / facility, on a temporary basis until such time as the Oakstead Community or portions thereof are developed with the Planned Residential Development described in the Annexation Agreement and Preliminary Development Plan previously approved by the Village; and

WHEREAS, §3.3 of the Annexation Agreement provides that interim uses be confined to the following:

The Village acknowledges that the current use of the Property is for agricultural purposes and that, notwithstanding any ordinance or law of the Village or any other provision of this Agreement, the Property may be used for agricultural purposes (including public or private nurseries) during the life of this Agreement and thereafter as permitted by law. Section 3.3.

WHEREAS, the Village and Developer desire to make this Third Amendment to the Annexation Agreement to amend, modify and change certain provisions of the Annexation Agreement, which additions, deletions and revisions are intended to be applicable to the Subject Property; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 11-15.1-1 et seq. and Section 7-1-1 et seq. of the Illinois Municipal Code, a proposed Third Amendment to Annexation Agreement was submitted to the Corporate Authorities for review and approval, and a public hearing was held thereon pursuant to notice and advertisement in the manner prescribed by law; and

WHEREAS, following said public hearing, the Corporate Authorities, after due and careful consideration, have concluded that the Third Amendment to Annexation Agreement will enhance and promote the general welfare and best interests of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the Village, after due deliberation, by

ordinance duly enacted, have approved the execution and delivery of the Third Amendment to the Annexation Agreement, and have directed the President and Clerk of the Village to execute the Third Amendment on behalf of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS. The preceding recitals are hereby made a part of this Third Amendment.
- 2. AUTHORITY. This Third Amendment is made pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 11-15.1-1 et seq. and Section 7-1-1 et seq. of the Illinois Municipal Code.
- 3. PROVISIONS TO BE AMENDED. Section 3.3 of the Annexation Agreement shall be and is hereby deleted in its entirety and shall be and is replaced by the provision set forth below.
 - 3.3 The Village acknowledges that the current use of the Property is for agricultural purposes and that, notwithstanding any ordinance or law of the Village or any other provision of this Agreement, the Property may be used for agricultural purposes (including public or private nurseries) during the life of this Agreement and thereafter as permitted by law; and furthermore, the portion of the Oakstead Community depicted on the attached Exhibit "B" to this Third Amendment to the Annexation Agreement may be used for a landscape waste composting facility defined as follows and subject to the conditions set forth in this Third Amendment:

A. Definitions:

COMPOST: A humus-like product derived from the process of composting.

COMPOSTING: An above-ground microbial process that converts organic waste to soil or mulch by decomposition of material through an aerobic process that requires adequate oxygen and moisture.

LANDSCAPE WASTE COMPOSTING FACILITY. An establishment for the composting of waste materials such as yard waste from care of lawns, shrubbery, vines and trees, pond weeds and water; and other waste items, including straw, livestock waste/livestock bedding; food scraps; and coffee grounds, not exceeding 40% of total volume, in accordance with

applicable IEPA regulations. Commercially available ingredients specifically designed to speed up or enhance decomposition are allowed to be used at such a facility.

B. Conditions:

- 1. The Owner and/or Operator of the facility shall obtain all permits for the facility required by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.
- 2. The total area of land dedicated to such use shall be not more than 40 acres.
- 3. All elements of the facility shall be setback be not less than 25 feet from all property lines.
- 4. The facility shall be located with adequate access from an arterial roadway.
- 5. Said arterial roadway shall be kept free of dirt / mud at all times.
- 6. The facility shall accept only the materials included in the definition of "landscape waste composting facility" set out in this Third Amendment.
- 7. Operational personnel shall be present during all hours of commercial operation.
- 8. Hours of commercial operation shall be limited to:

Monday - Friday from 5:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Saturday from 5:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Sunday - closed.

Provided also, there shall be no other business-related activities conducted outdoors later than two hours after close of commercial operations on any day.

- 9. Volume shall not exceed 160,000 cubic yards per year.
- 10. A gate shall be installed at the entrance to the facility (to bar access when closed).
- 11. Environmental testing shall be done to establish "base-lines" of conditions for: i) surface water; and ii) soil.
- 12. Before commencing operations, the Operator of the facility shall present to the Village for approval a plan/program for disposal of all composted material.
- 13. Before commencing operations, the Owner and/or Operator shall file with the Village a copy of the plan for closure of the facility according to requirements set forth by IEPA.
- 14. The following services shall be available to Village residents free of charge during Saturday hours of commercial operations only so long as the facility remains in operation: i) disposal of personal (not business) qualifying materials; and ii) picking up bulk compost products produced by the facility for personal use and based on availability.
- 15. Use of the prescribed portion of the Subject Property for the composing facility shall be allowed for an initial period of ten (10) years; and shall be subject to the following:
 - a) Such use may be terminated by the Village for breach of the conditions stated herein, upon written notice thereof from the Village to Owner and failure to cure within thirty (30) days thereafter;
 - b) Such use may be renewed at the option of Owner for successive one year periods, upon written notice of renewal from Owner to the Village not less than thirty (30) days prior to the end of the then-current term.
 - c) Such use may be closed at any time by the Owner, in accordance with the closure plan approved by IEPA.
 - d) Such use may be terminated at any time by agreement of the parties.
- 16. There shall be allowed two business signs on the premises, as follows: i) a ground sign meeting the requirements of §6-12-4(C) of the Village Code; and ii) a wall sign,

- including public notice language required by IEPA, meeting the requirements of §6-12-4(B)
- 17. The Owner shall provide no fewer than ten (10) parking spaces on the premises meeting the requirements for off-street parking set out in §6-11-2 et seq. of the Village Code.
- 18. The Owner/Operator shall obtain site plan approval and all applicable permits before commencing construction of any improvements on the portion of the Property described on Exhibit B.
- 19. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in §13.14 of the Original Agreement, the interim use described in this Third Amendment may continue beyond the term of the Original Agreement in accordance with the requirements of §3.3(B)(15) herein. Provided, further, nothing in this Third Amendment shall be deemed to have extended the term of any other provision of the Original Agreement without further action by the parties.
- 4. NOTICES. Any notice required pursuant to the provisions of the Annexation Agreement and this Third Amendment shall be in writing and be hand delivered or sent by certified mail return receipt requested, postage prepaid or by Federal Express or similar overnight courier service for delivery on the next business day to the following respective addresses until notice of change of address is given, and shall be deemed received, if hand delivered, when so delivered, or, if mailed by certified mail, on the fifth business day following deposit in the U.S. Mail or if sent by overnight courier on the next business day after delivery to such courier.

WHEREAS, said Ordinance provided for the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay principal and interest and other proper expense on said Bonds in the event that the alternate sources of funding otherwise provided for the payment of debt service on said Series 2016 Bonds were not available or sufficient to pay the outstanding debt service for any given fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, the bonds authorized by Ordinance No. 15-09 (and designated therein as "Series 2015") were re-designated as "Series 2016" bonds upon issuance, and were utilized to refinance and refund only a portion and not all of the Series 2009A Bonds; and

WHEREAS, said bonds by the terms of Ordinance No. 15-09 and the subsequent motion approving issuance of the bonds in 2016 are to be payable from certain alternate revenue sources, to wit:

- (i) all collections distributed to the Village from municipal utility taxes on electricity and gas imposed pursuant to Division 11 of Article 8 of the Illinois Municipal Code, as supplemented and amended from time to time, or substitute taxes therefor as provided in the future, and/or
- (ii) revenues or funds to be deposited by the Village in a special tax allocation fund created or designated pursuant to the Tax Increment Allocation

Redevelopment Act of the State of Illinois, as supplemented and amended from time to time (the "Pledged Revenues"), and,

(iii) in the alternative, if necessary, from ad valorem taxes levied against taxable property within the Village; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 15-09, authorizing the issuance of the bonds and filed with the County Clerk, provided for the levy of ad valorem real estate taxes in certain amounts to cover payments of principal and interest due on the bonds, including a levy of taxes sufficient to pay the principal and interest coming due during the period from May 1, 2017 to April 30, 2018 ("Fiscal Year 2018"); and

WHEREAS, the Village has accumulated or will have accumulated sufficient Pledged Revenues, as defined in Ordinance No. 15-09 for the purpose of paying debt service on the General Obligation Refunding Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Village is authorized to abate certain taxes when it is determined that sufficient funds are available from any other source which lawfully may be applied to payment of its obligations.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Corporate Authorities of the Village of Hampshire adopt the recitals set forth above, and hereby direct the application of the Pledged Revenues in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest due to be paid during Fiscal Year 2018 for the Village of Hampshire \$1,175,000 General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) Bonds – Series 2016 (previously designated as "Series 2015").

Section 2. The County Clerk is hereby directed to abate in its entirety the tax levy for the 2017 tax year (taxes collectable in 2018) for the \$1,175,000 General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2016, as set out in Ordinance No. 15-09 (and designated therein as "Series 2015" bonds), the authorizing ordinance previously filed with the County Clerk.

Section 3. Forthwith upon the adoption of this Ordinance, the Village Clerk shall file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the County Clerk of Kane County, Illinois.

Section 4. Any motion, order, resolution, or ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance is to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and waived.

Section 5. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is

for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

WHEREAS, on September 4, 2014, the Corporate Authorities of the Village approved a certain agreement with the owner of Parcel No. 01-11-100-016 (the "Subject Property") for development of the parcel and other matters related thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Owner of the Subject Property, to wit: Hampshire Venture One LLC and Hampshire Venture Two LLC (collectively, "Owner") agreed to develop the parcel in part with a new industrial building; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement with said Owner specifically provided as follows:

The Village shall abate the ad valorem real estate taxes for the Village otherwise levied on the Subject Property for a period of three (3) years commencing in regard to taxes to be assessed in 2015 and ending in regard to taxes to be assessed in 2017.

WHEREAS, the Agreement further provided that the Owner shall be allowed to divide the Subject Property into two separate parcels, with the understanding that the taxes shall be abated for each resulting parcel; and Owner has made such division (to wit: the "Nutriad Subdivision"); and

WHEREAS, the abatement of taxes on the Property is due for the 2017 tax year for taxes collectable in 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMPSHIRE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The portion of ad valorem real estate taxes due to the Village, including the portion due for Village pension purposes, for PIN: 01-11-180-001 and PIN: 01-11-180-002 (the "Subject Property") (formerly, PIN: 01-11-100-016) shall be and is hereby abated in its entirety for the tax year 2017 (collectable in 2018).

Section 2. The County Clerk shall abate the portion of the total ad valorem real estate taxes on the Subject Property that is due to the Village of Hampshire, including the portion due for Village pension purposes, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 3. Forthwith upon the adoption of this Ordinance, the Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy hereof with the County Clerk of Kane County.

Section 4. Any motion, order, resolution or ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance is to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and waived.

Section 5. If any section, subdivision, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be void, invalid, or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

Background. The Village of Hampshire participated in the Illinois Department of Economic Opportunity's Revolving Loan Fund Program to aid in economic development in the Village by establishing a low interest loan program to create or retain low to moderate income jobs. In order to clear the 2013 HUD monitoring finding concerning the revolving loan funds, the DCEO determine the appropriate course of action was to close the revolving loan fund program. As part of the closeout of the program the funds held by the Village have been withdrawn from the account held at Fifth Third Bank for this purpose and a cashier check made payable to the DCEO.

Analysis. The Village will no longer need to retain the Fifth Third bank account for this purpose, and the DCEO has requested that the Village pass a resolution shall be closed and the fund returned.

Recommendation. Staff requests passage of the resolution that follows this document.

RESOLUTION 18-
